ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This two-storey brick house has lost its wide veranda and spacious lawm, and the fence is now almost where the front steps once were. Construction is of brick laid in stretcher bond. It has been extensively repointed. The house is set on a high foundation. The high-pitched hip roof has gables over projecting bay on the facade and east sides. It is covered with standing-seam metal and has Philadelphia gutters and a boxed cornice with returns. There are two interior chimmeys. In each bay on the west side and in the projecting bay on the facade, there was originally a pair of narrow double-sash windows, 1-over-1 light, with brick sills and plain surrounds. Some have been replaced with single wide windows, also 1-over-1, matching other windows in the house. The veranda probably extended from the projecting bay on the facade around the corner to the projecting bay on the east side in which there is a second entrance. It has been replaced by small concrete stoops at the front and side entrances. There is a large two-storey rear wing which matches the main section on most details. A recent one-storey addition beside it fills in the NW corner. It has a shed roof and is covered with vertical wooden siding.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Richard T. Martin purchased a 50-acre tract from the Cochran estate in 1898 (ACDB 113-432) and built this house the next year. In 1906 he sold the house and 42 acres to James E. Gleason and M. F. Eddins (ACDB 134-84) who sold it the next year to Martha C. Sweeney et al (ACDB 136-340). Edward S. Wilder bought the house and 27 acres from them in 1914 and the other 15 acres in 1924 (ACDB 156-84, 186-350). He named it "Holly Hill" and subdivided the tract into several smaller parcels. The Wilder family sold the house and 3.91 acres to Tulita Pickens Miller in 1952 (ACDB 302-326). It was further subdivided after her death and had four owners between 1967 and 1976 when it was bought by the present owners (City DB 375-546). The veranda was probably removed c. 1960. Alterations were made in 1976 to adapt the first level for a kindergarten, and the one-storey wing was added in 1979. 


