



Historical information

The date of this building is uncertain. It may date to ca. 1910 (according to real estate records and Sanborn maps), but it may also have been built ca. 1930 on the site of an earlier house.

In 1920 the building (or its predecessor) was the Sigma Chi fraternity house. It was a private residence in the 1950s, and in the early 1960s the present owner, Phi Delta Theta fraternity, acquired
