ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Saint Anthony Hall is a tall and narrow building on a high foundation with 3-bay parapet-gabled facades on both Chancellor Street and Madison Lane. While the basic form is Colonial Revival, many details are Victorian. Walls and foundation are constructed of brick laid in 5-course American bond. Flush bands of vertical headers form the water table and a single stringcourse above the second storey. The high-pitched gable roof is covered with composition shingles and has close eaves with a boxed cornice with dentil moulding. The parapet gables terminate in corner buttresses. There is a circular-headed attic window in the parapet gable above each portico, and above that, a panel with the fraternity insignia. One interior chimney serves two fireplaces. Two-storey flat-roofed Tuscan porticoes cover both eastern and western facades. Their entablatures have dentil moulding. The western (Madison Lane) facade, not having had a portico originally, is also pilastered. The central entrances have round arches with concrete keystones and end blocks. The doors have six lights over a single panel, with half-round transoms with tracery. There is a pair of 12-light French doors with half-round transoms in each side bay of the eastern (Chancellor Street) facade. Most windows are double-sash, 6-over-6 light, with architrave trim and jack arches with stone keystones. Windows at the second level are somewhat shorter, and there are raised brick panels between the first and second levels. There are also several paired 6-light casement windows with half-round transoms with tracery. The 6-over-6 window over the stair landing has a fanlight and a brick panel above it. Basement windows are paired one-light casement, also with jack arches. A one-storey, flat-roofed, rectangular bay window supported on wooden consoles occupies the two western bays of the northern elevation at the first level. It has two double-sash windows with tracery, and fluted pilasters carrying an entablature. The great hall is handsomely paneled in oak. The casement windows and French doors are round-arched and have transoms with tracery. The fireplace has a Victorian mantel. At the rear of the room, a broad staircase with winders and a Victorian balustrade, all in oak, rises behind four oak Tuscan columns.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

The Saint Anthony Alumni Association of Virginia purchased this lot in 1900 ACDB 117-336. University records show that Delta Psi Fraternity build their chapter house, known as Saint Anthony Hall, in 1902. It was designed by a New York architect and was the first house to be built by a fraternity at the University as its chapter house. The house originally faced on Chancellor Street, but when other fraternities began to build on Madison Lane, an identical portico was built on the western elevation sometime before 1918.

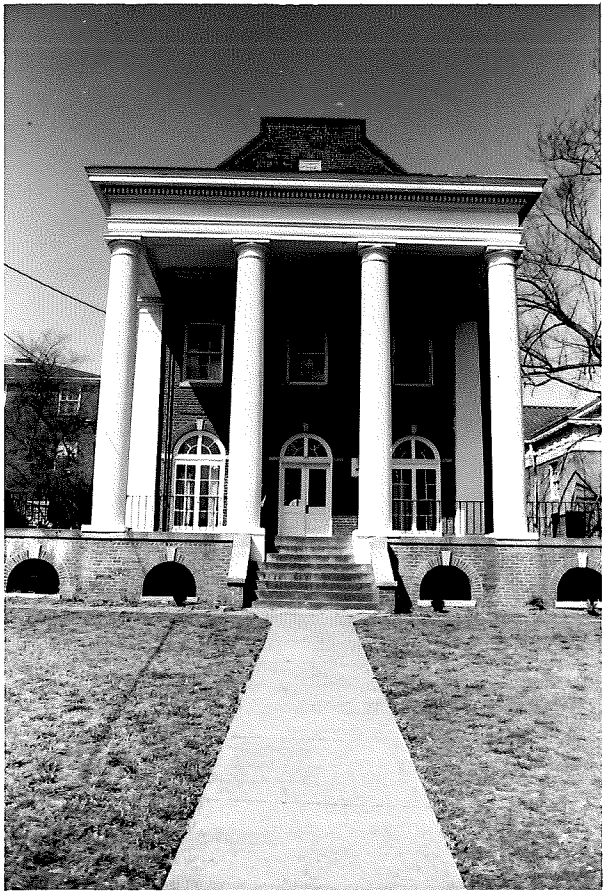

No project chimneys. No visible additions.

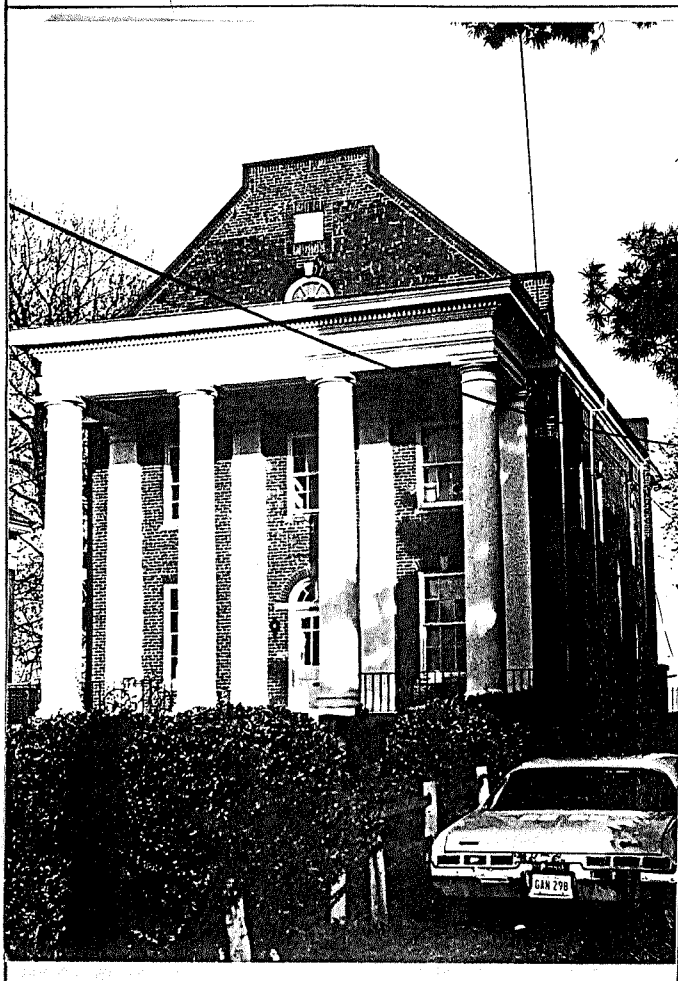

6. Statement of significance:

Among other things, the Rugby Road-University Corner Historic District is important because of the large number of historic and/or architecturally significant fraternity houses located there. Built mainly between 1910 and 1940, these houses represent an important aspect of student life at the University of Virginia.

The Saint Anthony Alumni Association of Virginia purchased this lot in 1900. University records shows that Delta Psi fraternity built their chapter house, known as Saint Anthony Hall, in 1902. It was designed by a New York architect and was the first house to be built by a fraternity at the University as its Chapter house. 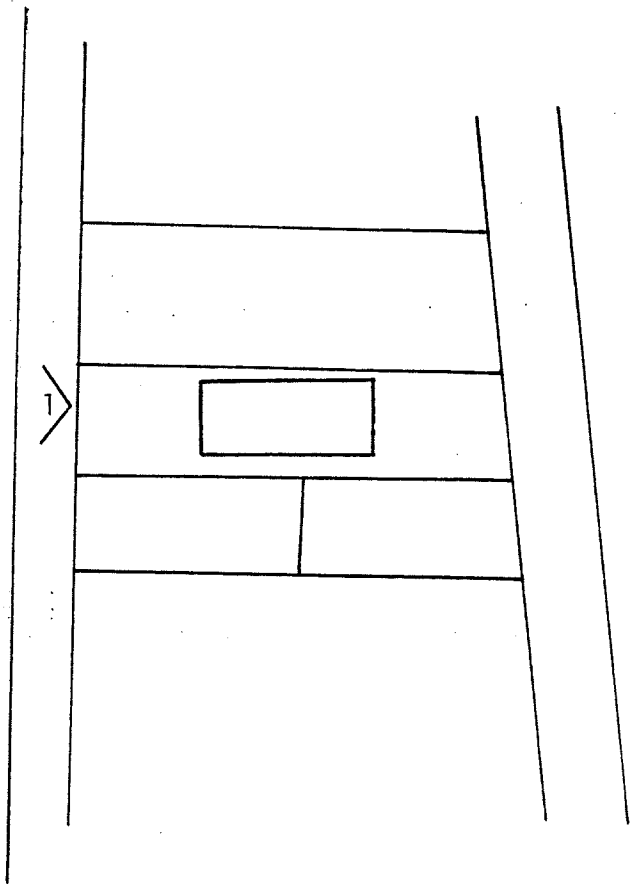

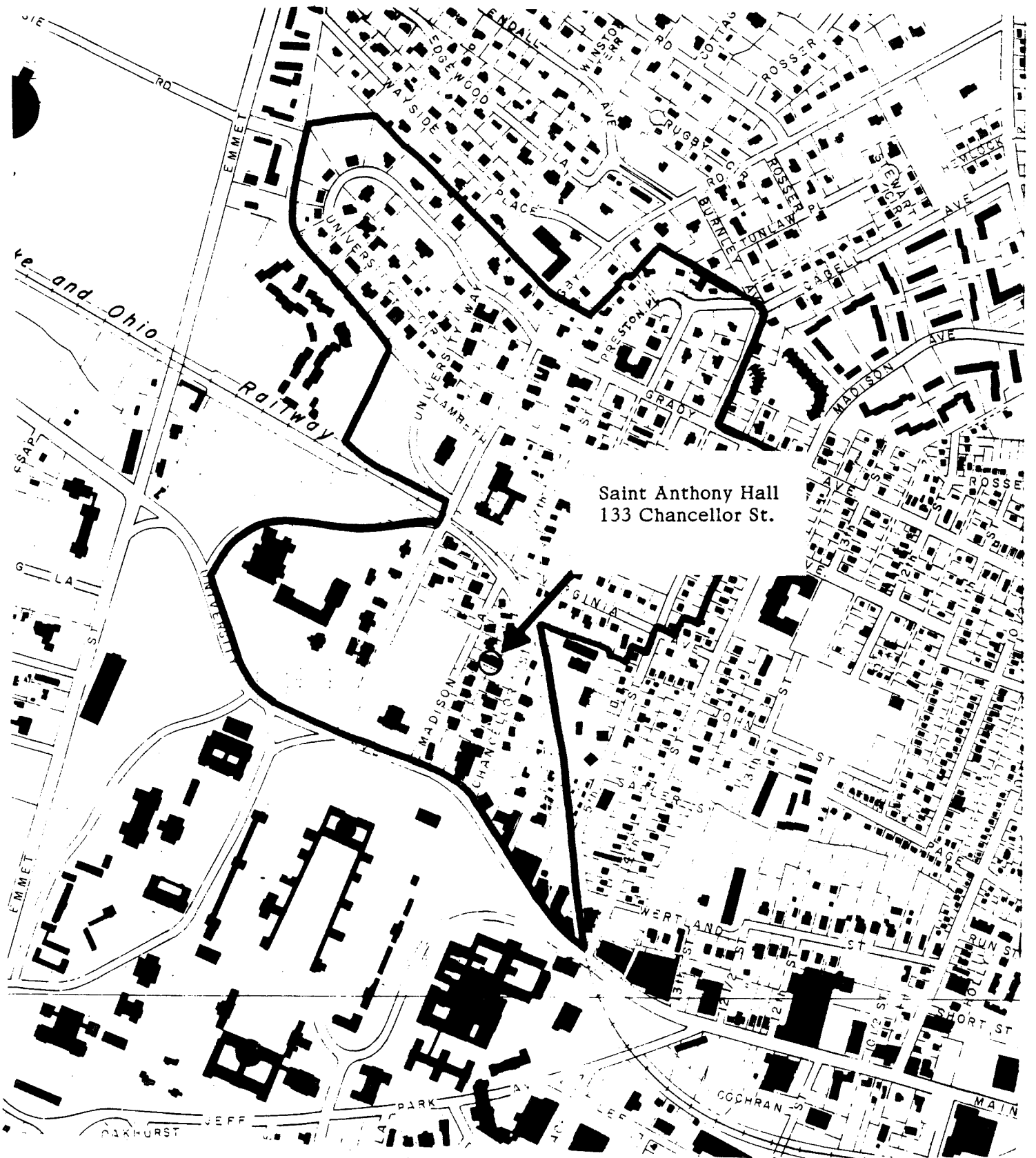

Description:

Colonial Revival rectangular block with gable roof ending in parapets; front and rear facades, each three bays wide, are in gable ends, each with tetrastyle two-story porticoes. Originally front entrance in southeast end, which has three two-leaf multi-light entrances with semi-circular fan lights, and a Doric portico with pilasters at outer edges; northwest facade has Doric portico with entrance containing single door topped by semi-circular fanlight. Parapets are edged with course of bricks set on end, and a plaque, apparently depicting fraternity insignia, is in each gable. Shallow bay window of wood, set on two scrolled brackets and containing two double-hung sash units flanked by fluted pilasters, projects from northeast side wall.

Significance Statement:

St. Anthony Hall was the first fraternity house built as such at the University of Virginia. "In 1900, the Saint Anthony Alumni Association of Virginia bought a lot of land on Chancellor Street from the heirs of Dr. J.E. Chancellor and then hired a New York architect to design the structure." "The house, costing \$20,000 was dedicated on Saturday, December 6, 1902 with an elaborate affair." "This event initiated two important trends in the fraternities' subsequent growth: first, some houses preferred to building on

private land while others desired University land; secondly, all fraternities preferred to build north of the Lawn along the Rugby Road axis" (Bishop 1981: 4-5). Delta Psi has occupied the house since its construction. It is architecturally one of the more unusual fraternity or sorority buildings at the University, and is an important component of the historic district (O'Dell 1983).

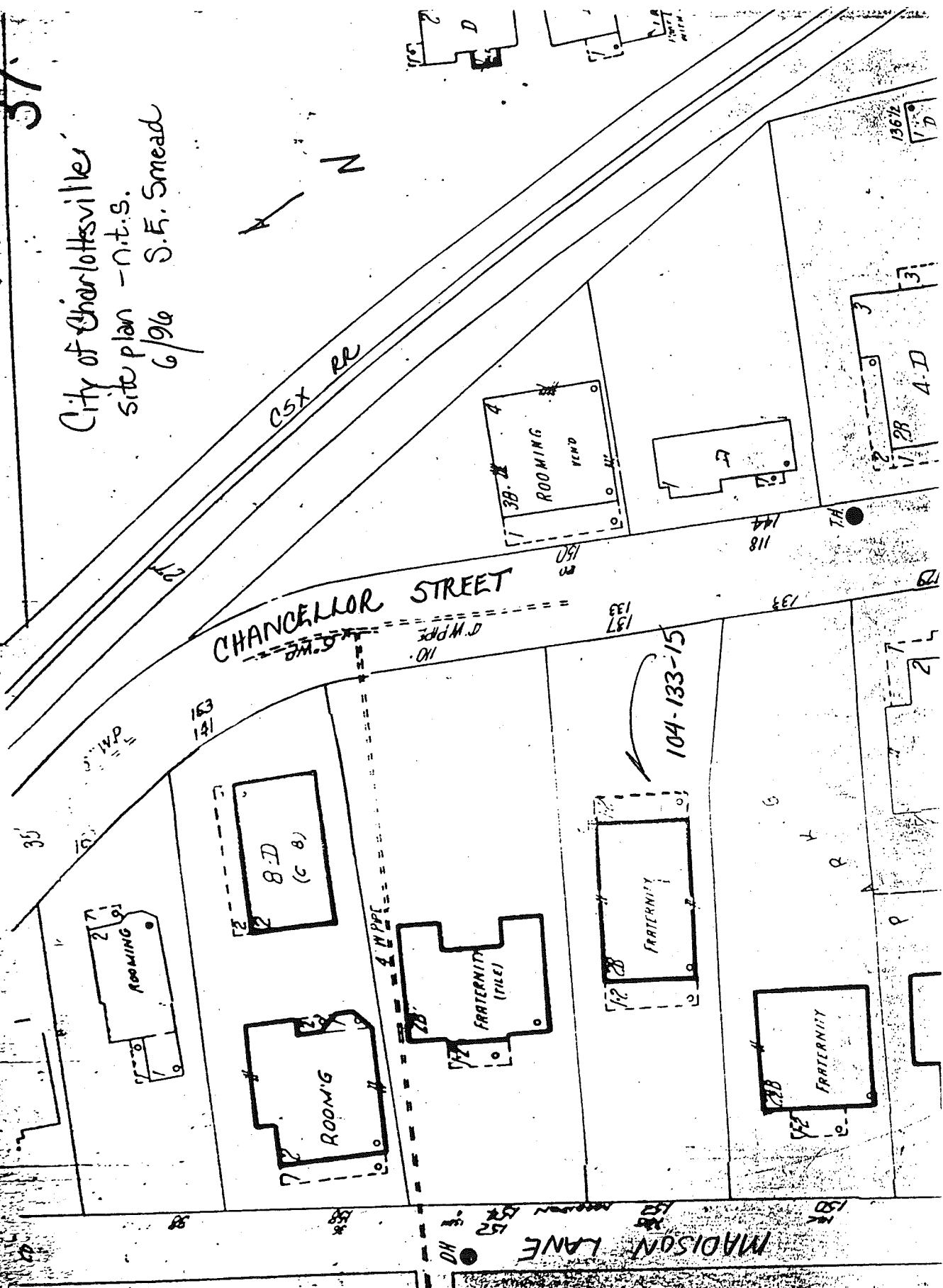
