



This eclectic house features complex massing at the front, with a 3-sided 2-story bay with oversailing cross-gable roof.

A one-story wing extends at the rear of the house. The house is approached by car from Madison Lane rather than Chancellor St.

Description:

Somewhat similar in design to dwelling at 167 Chancellor Street (VHDR resource no. 104-133-11). Late Queen Anne-style frame dwelling with Colonial Revival elements. Irregular form; main block has two-story bay window on the southwest half of the front facade, with large gabled dormer above, containing a two-over-two, double-hung sash window. The porch adjoins the bay, extending across the rest of the front facade, with Doric columns and turned wood spindles in the railing. The entrance has a transom; corner from the entrance, in the southeast end of the northeast side wall, there is a circular window, probably lighting the entrance foyer. weatherboards cladding the exterior end in corner boards; the boxed cornice has a frieze board below. There is a one-story, one-bay deep rear ell, with a low hipped roof.

The rear ell has a lower-height section along its northeast side, which was a porch through 1969, and has since been enclosed (Sanborn 1969).

Significance Statement:

This building was apparently built c. 1910 as a residence. It was the home of Judge W. S. Gooch in 1920; possibly the house was built for him.

it continued to serve as a dwelling; by 1941 it was functioning as a rooming house and continued to do so through 1969. Presently it appears to still be in use as a residence for students, as a supplemental residence for Alpha Phi (Sanborn 1913, 1920, 1929, 1941; O'Dell 1983). It is a good example of late Queen Anne-Colonial Revival; it contributes to the district, and with the dwelling next door at 167 Chancellor Street, forms an important part of the definition of the streetscape.




