Characteristic of its Classical heritage is the building's even fenestration, light colored key stone and belt course trim. Functional considerations forced the architect to open the wall surfaces to allow for better lighting, thus producing taller and wider window area than would be acceptable to the purist. Other features of the design, such as the Flemish bond brick work, the molded water table, and the paneled spandrels, are fairly typical of the recent Colonial revival in Charlottesville.
