The rear ell and porch of this one-story, three-bay, stuccoed frame house are the earliest sections of the building. Originally a gable-fronted "shotgun" form house with front and side shed porches, the dwelling was weatherboarded and had boxed eaves. The house was remodeled between 1929-1939 into its present form, at which time the stucco parging was also added to the exterior. The 1930s work incorporates exposed rafter ends beneath the eaves, and features a center front gable. Six-over-six double-hung wood sash are used in both sections of the dwelling, and two brick flues are visible from the back side of the house.

The property has remained in the ownership of only two families since its original construction.


