The house is on a relatively large, discontiguous parcel of 2.081 acres, the remainder of a 3.62-acre tract acquired by the Truehart family from miller Henry Hartman in 1891. The long rear property line that connects the two parts of the tract demarcates and earlier private road that led to Hartman's Mill. The northern portion of the two-part tract fronts on Raymond Road, and is the site for the Woodfolk House. A large area of this residential lot is a cleared yard with mature trees and shrubs, but a portion of it (at the rear) is wooded. A gravel driveway, bounded by a row of tall trees, is located on the east side of the house. A poured concrete walk, steps, and gateposts--focused on the central entry of the house--define entry to the house from the street. A small garage/meat house outbuilding is located at the end of the driveway, behind and east of the house. The southern parcel of

the Truehart-Woodfolk tract is a steeply sloped lot just past the end, and to the east of, Raymond Road. It is presently wooded with new-growth forest and underbrush.

Description:

This two-story, three-bay, stuccoed frame house is a typical early-twentieth-century dwelling with an I-house form, topped by a standing-seam-metal gable roof with a center front gable feature. A circular louvered vent highlights the central gable, while a wide friezeboard and boxed eaves detail the roof/wall junction. The hip-roofed front porch, three bays wide, has replacement supports and balusters. Two brick flues, each with a corbeled cap, are visible above the rear roof plane. Most windows in the house are six-over-six double-hung wood sash. The front entry features a modern wood paneled door with glazed upper panels. A two-story rear shed wing extends across the back of the house, and a corresponding two-story enclosed porch extends across the back of the wing.

Additions/Alterations Description:

The two-story rear porch was enclosed (screened above, walled in below), probably in the 1950s or 1960s. Wrought iron supports and balusters have replaced the original front porch posts. Aluminum storms have been added to

door and window openings. The front door is a replacement of the original.

A small frame storage shed/garage, with vertical board siding, is located approximately 20' to the rear of the house, at the end of the gravel-paved driveway.

Significance Statement:

The Woodfolk House is typical of the two-story, three-bay houses often built along Ridge Street and more rarely in the neighborhood east of Ridge Street in the early twentieth century. Its designer/builder was original owner Ollie T. Woodfolk. The house is among a group of properties associated with historic black settlement of the neighborhood. John Truehart and his wife Sallie Kimbo Truehart of Albemarle County acquired the original 3.26 acres in 1891 from miller Henry Hartman. In 1900 the Trueharts conveyed half-acre parcels to their sons William and J.J. Truehart, and in 1907 conveyed a half-acre parcel to their son Thomas Truehart. Daughter Mary Madlyn Truehart Woodfolk was married to Ollie T. Woodfolk, Sr., who built the present dwelling on the property prior to his death in 1925. Mary M.T. Woodfolk acquired the property in 1935, upon the death of her father John. Woodfolk descendents continue to own and live on the property to the present.


