



High Descripe This house is located on the site of an earlier house that was puilt in the mid-to-late - 1920.5. It home the Phi Epsilon P' fraternity from the early 1930s until & burned on 9/4/56. Photographs show that it was a 22-story, 3-bay double-pile brick house in the Colonial Revival style, similar to half a dozen others on the street, ats steep, gabled roof had three gabled dormers on the facade. Windows were 6 over-6 light with lowered shatters. The central intrame featured sidelighte transon, & corner lights with decorative glaging. It was shellered by a half-round hood with a bellcast pyramidal. roof with a finial. Allowed and a round arch was inscribed on the wall above it. (meno St) after the fire the fraternity sold the property (ity 0 5 198 - 215 + 222) . A. D. Wise built the present house in 1957, according to tax records, & immediately cold it to Elizabeth P. attantities Jones & her daughter ann Elizabeth Jones (DB 202-31). It is still owned by the Jones family and has been used as rental property since Mrs. Jones's death in 1976 (WB 20-444) 23-98 DB 697-647).
