

It has a medium-pitched hip roof covered with standing-seam tin, boxed cornice with dentil moulding, plain frieze, slender coupled Tuscan columns on square pedestals with inset panels, and Colonial Revival balustrade. There is a single-paned rectangular transom above the wide entrance door. A one-bay garage with corrugated metal siding and gabled roof stands behind the house. There is a stone retaining wall along the sidewalk.




