Thanks, Mary Joy.

The historic district NRN makes no mention of any particular landscape features of the district. The trees may have been plante by UVA Professor James W. Cole, Jr., who lived at the house into the mid-1940s, but could also have been planted by a subsequent owner into the 50s. Cole was the Dean of General Studies in the 1960s, long after he moved from the house. There is no evidence that he was known as a designer of any sort. All of this to say that the tree planting appears to not be significant and I would support their removal and replacement with something more appropriate. I don't think we need to ask them to replace in the same location. I think a better design could be provided with other types of medium deciduous trees planted to frame the house rather than stand in front of it. Smaller trees would also be more appropriate in scale for this house than the pines. Also, I recommend the trees are planted closer to the house and not under the utility lines.
