Townsend ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION This is a 2-storey, 2-bay, double-pile house with projecting bays on the facade and both sides. It is set on a low brick foundation, but the basement is above ground at the rear, because of the slope of the land. The high pitched hip roof is covered with standing-seam metal and has steep gables over the three projecting bays, projecting eaves and verges, scroll-shaped exposed rafter ends, and plain bargeboards. There are two interior chimneys. The second storey walls are slightly belicast and project beyond the first storey walls. They were originally covered with wooden shingles, while the first storey walls were weatherboarded. All are now covered with aluminum siding. Windows are double-sash, l-over-1 light, with plain trim. Those at the second level are slightly shorter. The south front corner of the house is chamfered and has a narrower window at each level. Large brackets with a sunburst motif support the overhanging corner of the roof. The north side bay of the facade projects very slightly at the second level only. There is a semi-octagonal projecting bay at the rear of each side of the house, with narrow windows at the sides and 2-over-2 light windows in the center, and the same sunburst brackets. A small square multi-light casement window on the north side lights the stair hall. A one-storey veranda covers the facade. Its medium-pitched shed roof, with a gable above the entrance in the northern bay, is covered with standing-seam metal and supported by chamfered square posts with a simple balustrade and no frieze. There are wide double entrance doors with a 2-light rectangular transon in the northern bay, flanked by narrow windows in place of sidelights. The back porch has been enclosed. HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION Ida L. Carver (Mrs. Charles L.) bought this lot in 1893 (City DB 4-66), and tax records show that she built the house the next year. She sold it to R. L. Thomas in 1917 (DB 31-77). It was returned to her in 1923 (DB 45-226) and sold to F. W. Twyman c. 1930 (DB 71-67). E. L. and Nannie N. Carroll bought it from Twyman's estate in 1938 (DB 97-114) and deeded it the next year to C. Claude Carroll (DB 114-212), who sold it to the present owners in 1954 (DB 178-117). They use it as rental property and have covered the walls with aluminum siding. It is occupied at present by their error son.
