ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This large T-shaped brick house is said to be the second house built after the Belmont estate was subdivided. Set on a low foundation, it is $2\frac{1}{2}$ storeys tall, three bays wide, and double pile, with a large two-storey central rear wing. Brick is laid in 5-course American-with-Flemish bond throughout the house and is painted white. The central block has a Mansard roof covered with pressed tin, with a boxed cornice and plain frieze. There are two dormers on the front and rear elevations. Their walls are covered with pressed tin, and they have 2-over-2 light windows with plain trim and nearly flat roofs with projecting eaves and boxed cornices. There are four capped semi-exterior end chimneys. There are two narrow 1-over-1 light, double-sash windows with louvered shutters in each side bay of the facade. The windows in the center bay and on the side and rear elevations are single wider 2-over-2 light. All have wooden sills and no surrounds. A one-storey, five-bay veranda covers the facade. It has a low-pitched hip roof covered with standing-seam metal with projecting eaves, a boxed cornice, plain frieze, and six square wooden pillars on cinderblock pedestals. Its concrete floor is at ground level. The entrance in the center bay has a semi-elliptical fanlight in a rectangular transom. The present asymmetrical composition of a single entrance door and sidelight probably replaces narrower paired doors. A semi-circular plastered arch separates the entrance and stair halls. The two-flight dog-leg stair has an Eastlake balustrade. The long two-storey central rear wing has a nearly flat roof with boxed cornice. Brickwork and windows match those in the main block. There is one interior chimney. A two-storey veranda with an exterior stair covers its east side. It has a nearly flat shed roof supported by bracketed square posts. The first level has a spool frieze, but has lost its balustrade. The shorter second level did not have a frieze, but its turned balustrade has survived. A oneroom, flat-roofed addition constructed of rock-faced concrete block covers the rear bay of the west side of the wing.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

S. A. Eddins purchased two lots in the new Belmont subdivision in 1895 (ACDB 102-309, 103-50) and built this house the same year, according to tax records. He deeded it, along with a third lot, to F. A. Eddins and Q. E. Eddins in 1897, and in 1903 F. A. Eddins sold his share to Q. E. Eddins (ACDB 111-384, 125-397). F. A. Eddins later operated the University Dry Cleaners. The large rear wing, if not original, was added before 1907. The Eddins family lived in the house for awhile, but when they sold it to Samuel J. Robinson in 1906, the deed stated that the Robinson family was living there (ACDB 132-468). Robinson conducted a grocery business on Main Street. His wife died in 1939, and he died in 1942 (City WB 5-97), and in 1945 their heirs sold the family home and a fourth lot which they had bought (City DB 121-179 & 180). The house passed through several ownerships during the next 16 years and was used as rental property (DB 157-424, 207-136 & 139, 212-477, 226-303 & 305). Vaden B. and Nellie C. Thomas bought it in 1961 and divided it into five apartments (DB 227-154, WB 20-548).
