ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This large Tudor Revival house originally consisted only of the two-storey central block and l½-storey side wing. Additional wings at each end have made it one of the most pretentious houses in the City. The house is set on a low foundation, but the slope of the land is such that the basement is above ground at the rear. The foundation and first storey walls are constructed of brick laid in Flemish bond. There is no water table. Second storey walls are half-timbered. The central block has a hip roof, and all wings and projecting bays have gable roofs. All are highare covered with brown composition shingles, and have boxed cornices. Most have close verges. Most windows are double-sash, 6-over-6 light, with plain trim. They are the same height at the first and second levels. Basement windows are somewhat shorter. The hip-roofed, 2-storey, 3-bay, single-pile central block has two exterior end chimneys. The south bay projects on the facade, and the north bay projects on the rear elevation. On the facade, the gable roof of the projecting bay extends down to form one plane of the gable roof of a one-storey projecting central entrance bay. The walls of this projection and of a shallow, one-storey, hip-roofed wing that extends from it across the northern bay of the facade, are constructed of coursed fieldstone. The 10-paneled oak entrance door is Tudor-arched with concrete quoins and label moulding. A 6-light casement window on the south side lights the vestibule, and a circular-headed door gives access to the entrance hall. Beyond that point, the interior is Colonial Revival, not Tudor Revival. A large 8-over-8 light window with half-round fanlight in the center of the rear elevation lights the elliptical staircase. There are two windows in each side bay at the second level in the central block and usually a group of three at the first level. There is a one-storey semi-octagonal bay window in the northern bay of the facade. There is an eyebrow dormer centered on the facade and a shed-roofed dormer with three small windows on the rear elevation. The roof rises slightly into a sort of low shed-roofed wall dormer above the second storey windows. The original $l^{\frac{1}{2}}$ -storey north wing has a single gable-roofed dormer on the facade. The newer wing beyond it has its gable end on the facade. On both front and rear elevations, the second storey projects on struts and has a semi-octagonal bay window sheltered by an extension of the roof. The $1\frac{1}{2}$ -storey south wing is long and lacking in architectural detail. Front and rear elevations have one tri-partite window at the first level. There is a single large shed-roofed dormer with two full-sized windows on the rear elevation, but none on the facade. The rear plane of the roof extends into a lower pitched shed roof.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Alice Ix purchased this lot in 1929 (ACDB 208-445). Her husband Frank Ix, Jr., had come to Charlottesville to manage the branch of Frank Ix & Son, Inc., which was established here in 1927. According to tax records, the house was built c. 1930. Elmer Burruss was the architect. The two additions, probably in the early 1950's, were designed by Milton Grigg. Mrs. Ix sold the house in 1973 to James C. & Annie Lee Gianakos (City DB 346-372), who sold it to Peter V. R. & Ruth B. Weeks in 1980 (DB 410-249)
