## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This large, high-ceilinged house was reportedly once used as a private hospital. It is 2½ storeys tall, three bays wide, and double pile and is set on a high foundation of brick laid in 5-course American bond with a stepped water table. Wall construction is of brick laid in 5-course American-with-Flemish bond. The dominant feature of the house is its high-pitched truncated hip roof covered with patterned metal. It has projecting eaves and a boxed cornice with dentil moulding. There are two interior end chimneys on the east side of the house and a smaller capped one at the west side of the rear. Windows are double-sash, 2-over-2 light, with brick sills and plain surrounds. They are segmental arched and about the same height at both levels. They once had shutters. Those at the first level of the facade and at the rear of the western elevation are extremely wide. In the center of the second level of the facade, under a single segmental arch and diamond-paned rectangular transom, there are two small 4-over-4 light windows with paneled spandrels and glass shutters with diamond glazing in the upper half. A group of three. dormers is centered on the facade, a large one flanked by smaller ones set slightly lower on the slope of the roof. They have pedimented gable roofs and sides covered with patterned metal. There is one double-sash window in each of the small dormers and three in the larger ones, all with diamond glazing in the top sash. There is a matching small dormer on the east side of the house and a medium-sized one with two windows on the west side. An original 2-storey wing covers most of the western half of the rear elevation. It has a pedimented gable roof and a small capped interior end chimney. A smaller, flat-roofed, 2-storey wing is centered on the rear elevation of the main block. The first storey may be original, but the second is a later addition. A one-storey shed-roofed back porch covering the rest of the rear elevation has been enclosed, as has a small, flat-roofed, 2-storey porch in the southwest rear corner of the house. A one-storey veranda covers the facade and most of the west side and originally extended into a porte cochere on the east side. The porte cochere has been removed, and the side portion of the veranda has been enclosed as a sun parlor. The veranda has a nearly flat metal roof with projecting eaves, an entablature with dentil moulding, Tuscan columns, and a simple balustrade. At the corners, there are paired columns with small sections of Chinese Chippendale balustrade between them. The segmental-arched central entrance door has a single pane over a panel and is flanked by diamond-paned sidelights over panels. The interior follows the central hall plan. There is a 2-flight open-well stair with Victorian balustrade in a stair hall in the center of the west side of the house. A door from the stair hall opens onto the western section of the veranda which has been enclosed. The parlor mantel is very ornate with egg-&-dart moulding, marble surround, fluted columnettes, and columned over-mantel with relief ornamentation.

## HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Mary W. Randolph (Mrs. W. M. Randolph) bought this lot in 1899 (City DB 10-194) and built the house the next year, according to tax records. She traded it to Ellie M. Elliott (Mrs. John F. Elliott) in 1904 for "Oak Lane" at 1301 Park Street (DB 15-188). Mrs. Elliott sold it to her son Millard C. Elliott in 1916 (DB 28-266), and he sold it in 1920 toMorris Rubin (DB 35-206) who, in turn, sold it to Charles R. Jones in 1924 (DB 47-387). His daughter Emma B. Henshaw inherited it and owned it until 1979 (WB 4-229). During that half-century, the house was used variously as a boarding house, tourist home, and rooming house. The High Street Land Trust purchased the house in 1979 (DB 399-371) and sold it in 1982 to the 800 East High Street Land Trust (DB 428-228) which renovated it and sold it to the Bacchus Land Trust in 1983 (DB 436-267).
