## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

The north wing of Braeview was built several years before the south wing, but the plans show that the entire house was designed as a whole. An early photograph of the north wing shows the attic door into the future south wing. The north wing is two storeys tall, two bays wide, and double pile. The south wing is  $2\frac{1}{2}$  storeys tall, three bays wide, and double pile, and it projects slightly beyond the other on the facade and farther at the rear. The floor and roof levels of both sections are the same. The house is set on a low brick foundation with a partial basement. Wall construction is of brick laid in Flemish bond. The step gables roofs of both sections are covered with slate and have parapet gables and mousetooth cornice. The north wing has two capped interior end chimneys at its north end. There are two capped interior and chimneys joined by a curtain wall at each end of the south wing. Windows are double-sash, 12-over-12 light, with white concrete jack arches with keystones. There are paneled shutters at the second level. Windows are the same height at both levels and in both sections. First level windows on the rear elevation of the south section have paneled spandrels. There are three gable-roofed, slate-walled dormers on the front and rear elevations of the south section. Each has a nearly full-sized 12-Over-12 light window. There is a single half-round attic window at the south end. A one-storey semi-octagonal bay window is set under a wide segmental arch in the south bay of the north section. It gives the appearance of having been added later to fill in the original entrance after the larger south section was built, but is said to be original. It has three pairs of 12-light casement windows and a nearly flat roof with boxed cornice. There is a frontispiece entrance in the center bay of the south section. Fluted Doric pilasters support a triangular pediment with modillions and cornice There is a half-round transom with Gothic tracery above the six-paneled door. There is a pair of returns. 12-light French doors in the center bay of the rear elevation. An arcaded one-storey porch at the south end of the house has been enclosed as a sun parlor. There are three 4-light casement windows in each round-arched bay and a pair of French doors in one rear bay. The flat roof has a corbelled brick cornice and a wrought iron roof balustrade. There is an original small one-storey wing with smaller 8-over-8 light windows at the north end of the house. Its gable roof with parapet gable continues as a shed roof over a brick-walled screened porch on the facade.

The  $l_2^1$ -storey garage with servants' quarters above is also constructed of brick laid in Flemish bond and has a steep slate roof with parapet gables and mousetooth cornice and two interior end chimneys. The windows are 5-over-6 light with jack arches.

## HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

W. Allen Perkins purchased 1.66 acres in the Meadowbrook Hills subdivision in 1922 (ACDB 178-406). Architect Eugene Bradbury's plans, dated 1922, are for the entire house, but an early photograph shows that only the north section was built initially. Tax records show that this was in 1923. Tradition says that the larger south section was built about 1929 by William E. Atkinson who has bought the house and two additional lots in 1928 (ACDB 202-481, 208-497). Tax records, however, give no indication of its having been built in two stages. Lydston D. B. Cady bought the house from Atkinson's estate in 1945 (City DB 123-78) and sold it to J. Dean Tilman, Jr., and Meda McNeir Tilman in 1948 (DB 139-278).
