ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This is a rather late example of the Queen Anne style, more in the mode of the residences built on Ridge Street two decades earlier. It is 2½ storeys tall and basically two bays wide and triple pile, but its silhouette is broken by bay windows, projecting bays, and a tower. The walls were originally weatherboarded, but they have been covered with studeo, significantly altering the appearance of the building. It is painted white with light green trim. The house is set on a low brick foundation and has a partial basement. The medium-pitched hip roof is covered with standing-seam metal and has projecting eaves, Philadelphia gutters, boxed cornice, and a plain frieze. There is a pedimented gable over the semi-octagonal projecting center bay on the west side. Its overhanging corners are not supported on brackets. The gable is weatherboarded and contains a 4-light casement window. Hiproofed dormers with 3-over-3 light double-sash windows are centered on the facade, east side, and rear. There are. two large (assymetrically) placed interior end chimneys and a smaller interior chimney toward the rear of the house. Windows are double-sash, 9-over Dight, and narrower paired 6-over-1 light, with plain trim. Those at the second level are nearly as tall as those at the first. There is a tripartite window in the center plane of the semioctagonal projecting bay on the west side, with a 9-over-1 light window flanked by 6-over-1 light windows. In the center bay on the east side there is a one-storey rectangular bay window with a pair of 6-over-1 light windows. A three-storey octagonal tower projects from the southwest front corner of the house. There are 9-over-1 light windows in three planes at the first and second levels. The smaller third storey of the tower is set upon the hip roof above the second storey. Its three smaller windows have been boarded up. Above this is a tent roof with ball finial. Both roofs have boxed cornices. A one-storey veranda covers the facade and extends along the west side of the projecting bay. It has a low-pitched hip roof covered with standing-seam metal with boxed cornice and plain frieze, supported by eight Tuscan columns without a balustrade. Matching entrance doors in the east bay of the facade and in the projecting bay on the west side have 12 small lights over three panels. Both have multi-light rectangular transoms, and the front door also had sidelights over panels, now boarded up. A two-flight dog-leg stair with simple balustrade rises from the entrance hall in the southeast front corner of the house. The stair landing occupies a la-storey semi-octagonal bay window with a single l-over-1 light windows. A two-storey back porch one covered the western two-thirds of the rear elevation, with central doors at each level. It has been replaced with a concrete terrace, and the upper door has been boarded up. Another door at the rear of the east side, on the back stair landing has also been closed and its exterior stair removed.

planned HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Despite its pretentious appearance, this picturesque house was never the manor house of a large estate or the home of a wealthy merchant. Although surrounded by the lands of the Lankford Greenhouses, this lot was never a part of the greenhouse property. Anna B. Clarkston, a granddaughter of the Goins family who lived across the street, bought this lot in 1911 (ACDB 147-311) and huilt the house in 1915, according to tax records. She lived in Richmond, and tradition says that she planeed to return to Charlottesville and conduct a rooming house. She died then sold it in 1920 to Horace E. Tonsler, Jr. (City DB 35-398). The house was owned by various members of the DB 173-400, 209-453; WB 12-377; DB 305-365, 418-199). The Tonslers apparently always used the house as partments about 20 years ago. once

This house is a rather late example of the Queen Anne style for the area, being more in the mode of the large residences built along Ridge Street in the 1890s. It stands two-and-a-half stories tall, five bays wide, and three rooms deep, and features several multistory projecting bays, a polygonal corner tower, and hipped dormers in the complex hip-and-gable roof. A wraparound porch of eight bays is supported by square columns between which run simple rectangular balusters. The octagonal corner tower is topped with a tent roof and cast metal ball final. Nine-over-one double-hung sash (singles and pairs) are the predominant windows used throughout the house, but six-over-one sash are also used to create groupings in the projecting pedimented two-story side bay. The pedimented gable end retains original weatherboarding and is pierced by a four-light casement window. The three hipped dormers, centered on the front, rear, and east sides, have three-over-three double-hung sash windows. The standing-seam-metal roof has projecting eaves, Philadelphia gutters, a boxed cornice, and a plain frieze. The rear elevation reveals evidence of a former two-story porch (now removed). The main entry incorporates a single-leaf door with twelve lights over three panels, surrounded by a multilight rectangular transom and matching sidelights. A second front entry, located at the projecting side bay, uses a similar treatment, lacking only the sidelights.

Condition: Good-Fair Threats to Resource: None Known

Additions/Alterations Description:

Stucco parging was added over the original weatherboards in the mid-twentieth century. The two-story, two-level rear porch has been removed and replaced with a poured concrete patio. The rear second-story door, which formerly provided access to the rear porch, has been closed up.

Significance Statement:

Anna B. Clarkston, a Goins family descendent, bought this lot in 1911 (ACDB 147:311) and built the house in 1915, according to tax records. She lived in Richmond, and tradition notes that she intended to return to Charlottesville and conduct a rooming house. Clarkston died before the house was completed, though; her daughter, Imogene Clarkston West lived there for a few years before selling in in 1920 to Horace E. Tonsler, Jr. (City DB 35:398). The house was owned by various members of the Tonsler family and used as rental property until James D. and Gail R. Howard purchased it from Lawrence Tonsler in 1981 (WB 4:7, 7:146; DB 173:400, 209:453; WB 12:377; DB 305:365, 418:199). It has been divided into two apartments and remains in use as a duplex (owners occupy portion, rent other apartment). According to local tradition, the house was built for "a madam from New York," but due to a poor location (e.g., in a family-oriented neighborhood) it didn't operate as a brothel for very long. One local informant indicates that the builder was local black contractor Charlie Coles, who built all of the houses in the area that have corner towers, "his signature motif."
