ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This house is thought to have grown from a very humble 1-over 1 room structure with a one-storey shed addition at the rear. The two-storey section was more than doubled in 1906 and a later addition filled in the ell. In its present form, this is a 2-storey, 3-bay, single-pile house with a series of rear additions that make it doublepile. It originally rested on brick piers, but a basement has been dug out by Mr. Jackson. The widening and raising of Lankford Avenue has put the front porch at ground level. Olive green asbestos shingles cover the original weatherboarding. The front section of the house has a low-pitched gable roof covered with standing-seam metal with a boxed cornice. A nearly flat shed roof shelters the western rear addition, while the older eastern rear section, now two storeys, has a low-pitched gable roof. One chimney is located exterior to the 2-storey front section, between it and the original wing, and another is located at the rear of the western extension of the 2-storey section. Windows are double-sash, 2-over-2 light on the facade and west side, and 6-over-6 light on the east side (the older section). One window in the original section has architrave trim, but all the others have plain trim. A wide 1-storey, 1-bay porch is centered on the facade. It has a hip roof covered with standing-seam metal with boxed cornice, plain frieze, turned posts, and a concrete floor. It has no balustrade. There is a rectangular transom above the entrance door in the center bay. The original 1-storey shed addition at the rear has been enlarged by the addition of a low-ceilinged second storey. A series of 1-storey cinderblock additions cover the entire rear elevation.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

There was a community of free blacks on Lankford Avenue as early as the 1840's. Warner Howard purchased this lot and the one adjoining it on the east between 1871 and 1875, but did not receive a deed until some years later (ACDB 71-95, 95-237). Tradition says that he built a house there in 1871 and that it consisted of a one-over-one room cottage (the eastern half of the present front section) with a shed room behind it. Tax records do not reflect either the sale or the construction until the 1875 re-appraisal, however. Howard had the second lot deeded to his son George B. Howard (ACDB 95-237). Warner Howard died in 1906 and left his home to his two daughters Louisa H. Howard and Rosa Howard Riddick (ACWB 31-307). Tax records show that the front section of the house was enlarged to its present size that same year. In 1951 Gertrude Louise Riddick Cooper, who had inherited it from her mother and aunt (City WB 3-396, 4-127), moved across the street and sold this house to Lewis W. and Bessie B. Jackson (City DB 157-476). They have covered the walls with asbestos shingles and built a series of rear additions.

The Howard-Jackson House occupies two lots and contains an expansive ornamental garden with numerous flowering and specimen plantings, rock-defined plant beds, and hedge-defined terraces. The house's front entry is now slightly below street level, due to the widening and raising of Lankford Avenue in the late twentieth century. Brick piers topped with concrete urns flank the concrete steps that lead from the public sidewalk down to the front entry walk of the house. Stone retaining walls and piers define the boundaries of a concrete-paved parking area to the east side of the house.

This two-story, three-bay frame house was built in two major stages, with later modifications to the rear. The house in its original form (built 1871) was a two-story, one-room-plan dwelling (the eastern end of the present house), with a one-story rear shed room, six-over-six double-hung sash, architrave trim, and an exterior (west) end brick chimney. In 1906, the house was doubled in size towards the west, creating a two-story, three-bay dwelling. The standing seam metal gable roof, center front gable feature, two-over-two double-hung sash, front porch with turned posts, and Craftsman-influenced entry date to this major expansion. During this period, the building was sheathed in weatherboards.

Condition: Good Threats to Resource: Major Alteration

Additions/Alterations Description:

Post-historic-period additions and alterations to the house include the application of asbestos shingles over the original weatherboards, the replacement of the original brick pier foundation with a solid concrete block basement foundation, the addition of several rear wings, ells, and patios, and replacement of the front porch floor with a concrete slab.

Relationship of Secondary Resources to Property: The modern one-story, one-bay gable-front garage is of concrete block construction with T-1-11 siding in the gable ends and asphalt shingle roofing.

DHR Historic Context: Domestic Ethnicity/Immigration

Significance Statement:

Warner Howard, an early black landowner in the community of African-Americans located just east of Ridge Street, purchased this property (two lots) between 1871 and 1875 and built the original section of the house in 1871. Howard died in 1906, leaving the property to his daughters Louisa H. Howard and Rosa Howard Riddick. Tax records indicate that the house was expanded the same year. In 1951 Lewis W. and Bessie B. Jackson acquired the property from a Howard descendent, and initiated a series of changes and modifications to the property, including asbestos shingles and several rear additions. The property's extensive ornamental landscape is distinctive and unusual.
