ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This farmhouse appears to have grown from a 2-over-2 room brick house without a central hall. It is now a 2-bay, This farmhouse appears to have grown from a 2-over-2 room brick house without a central hall. It is now a 2-bay, double-pile, side-hall-plan house with a large two-storey rear wing covering the original portion of the main block. It is set on a low foundation. Construction is of brick, laid in 6-course American bond in the original portion of the main block and in stretcher bond in the newer portion and in the wing. A cross-shaped, medium-pitched gable roof shelters the main block, the ridge over the original portion running from east to west and the one over the side hall addition intersecting it. It is covered with asphalt shingles and has projecting eaves and verges, boxed comice, comice brackets on the facade and south side, and a plain board frieze. The original east and west gables are weatherboarded; the newer north and south ones are covered with wooden shingles. There is a capped chimney centered between the original rooms and a small exterior end chimney on the north side. Windows are double-sash, 2-over-2 light, with wooden sills, plain surrounds, and green louvered shutters. Those at the first level are segmental-arched. A one-storey veranda covers the facade. The entrance door is in the northern bay of the facade. This is the portion that was added later. The original entrance in the southern bay has been replaced with a window. The two-storey rear wing is set lower than the main block and also has lower ceilings. It has a medium pitched gable roof with boxed cornice and plain frieze. The gable end is covered with wooden shingles. Windows match those in the main block. There is an entrance porch on the south side of the wing with a shed roof with boxed comice, plain frieze, square piers, and brick and concrete floor. The wall is faced with white wooden board-and-batten siding within the entrance porch. A 2-storey L-shaped back porch originally covered the northern side of the wing and the eastern side (rear) of the newer portion of the main block. The part along the wing has been removed and replaced with a soapstone terrace. has been removed and replaced with a soapstone terrace.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

John A. Smith purchased several large tracts of land from the Locust Grove Investment Company in 1904 (ACDB 129-403). Tax records indicate that he built the original portion of the house the next year. The Sanborn map shows that additions had brought it to its present form by 1929. Smith operated a dairy farm on the property. In the division of Smith's estate in 1925, this property was awarded to his son Willie H. Smith (ACDB 192-71). After he retired from farming, he sold most of the land in 1941, the year before his death (ACWB 36-576). His widow continued to sell off lots, but kept the family home. Her grandson James R. Harlow bought it from her estate in 1973 (City WB 17-53, DB 350-519), but sold it the next year to James F. Jones (DB 355-579) who further subdivided the lot and repoyeted the house. Report M. and Althea Stewart bought the house in 1974 (DB 361-307) and sold it in 1976 to and renovated the house. Robert M. and Althea Stewart bought the house in 1974 (DB 361-307) and sold it in 1976 to William L. and Linda S. Bressler (DB 374-575), who sold it to the present owners in 1978 (DB 393-722). They have converted the 2nd storey into a separate apartment.

SIGNIFICANCE

This vernacular farmhouse stood north of the Locust Grove subdivision on a 235-acre farm.




