



One of the most handsome edifices on the UVa campus, Lambeth Field was one of several similar playing field stadia built at various US college campuses in the early 1900s.

The playing field was excavated ca. 1901, and the present concrete bleachers replaced wooden ones ca. 1911-13, when the colonnade was built. The Roman Doric colonnade forms a semicircle around the brow of the hill. At either end are arcaded loggias fronting storage rooms.

The structure is currently in disrepair and is only gradually being rehabilitated.
Historical information

Lambeth Field, named after Wm. Lambeth, UVa's Director of Athletics, was the first football field at the school having stationary seating. The field was used until Scott Stadium replaced it in 1931. Since then, it has served as a place for student gatherings and intramural, sports.

Recently the Lambeth housing project, just west, was erected on part of the former playing field.
