The slope of the land is s-ch that the foundation is low at the front and high at the rear of the house. There is a stepped water table. The house has a madium-pitched hip roof, covered with red tile, with deeply projecting eaves and exposed rafter ends. A hip-roofed dormer with two 3-over-3 light attic windows is centered on the rear elevation. There is a large interior chimney with stuccoed stack between the rooms on the east side of the house and a large interior end chimney wity a new brick stack at the west side of the rear elevation. Windows are of several types: Tripartile double-sash windoes, with 8-over12 light flanked by 4-over-6 light, are set within segmental-arched recesses in the side bays at the first vevel of the facade. Windows on the ends of the house at the first level are paved 8-light casement. Casement windows with diamond glazing flank the rear chimney. Most windows at the second level are 8-over-8 light with lowered shutters. In the center bay of the facade, above the entrance, there are three separate, narrow, 4-over-4 light windows with louvered shutters. In the center of the rear elevation, a flat-roof rectangular bay window on consoles lights the stair landing. It has 4light casement windows. The 6-panel entrance door in the center bay of the facade has multi-light transom and sidelights and is sheltered by a pergola supported by four one-storey Tuscan columns. The flanking one-storey wings project slightly from the facade. The eastern wing is a sun parlor with 4-over-6 light windows, some now covered with plywood. It has a nearly flat hip roof, covered with standing-seam metal, with deeply projecting eaves and bracket-like rafter ends. The western wing, now enclosed with plywood, was originally an open plazza with a pergola supported by Tuscan columns. An original 2-storey rear wing with basement covers the eastern bay. The interior follows the traditional central hall plan. There is a 2-flight open-well stair with simple balustrade in the broad central entrance hall. Fluted columns support an entablature with dentil moulding above the entrance to the parlor. Scoville HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION lau In 1913 Ellen B. Rixey sold a 4-acre tract adjacent to her home to her son-in-law Robert F. Compton (City DB 33-378). Tax records show that he built this house the same year. It was designed by Eugene Bradbury. /in 1913, the same year that Mrs. Rixey sold her own house, the Comptons sold this house to Grace Ellen Lee (DB 33-355). Mrs. Scoville called it "The Anchorage". She died in 1936 (WB4-196), and her heirs sold the house in 1937/to Emmett E. Haynes (DB92-191), from whom Charles W. & Nina L. Berry bought it the next year (DB 96-243). Chi Corporation of Zeta Beta Tan Fraternity bought the house from Mrs. Berry's estate in 1958 (ACWB 23-362; City DV 204-434). It has now been the Zeta Beta Tan house for a quarter of a century.
