ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This one-story, four-bay, vernacular Modern brick house has a hipped roof clad with asphalt shingles, and an unusual form consisting of a rectangular block with a one-bay-wide hip-roofed projecting section at the center of the front facade. Alongside this section is a one-bay entrance porch set under the house's roof, with an openwork concrete block half-wall at the side and an iron porch support atop the half-wall. The house's roof has deep eaves. The windows are horizontally-divided two-over-two double-hung wood sash, and a large three-part window consisting of a picture window flanked by small horizontally-divided two-over-two double-hung sash windows is in the projecting section on the house's front facade. The windows have brick sills, and inoperable louvered shutters. The house is set into the slope that parallels the southeast side of Ridge Street, and therefore has a raised basement at the rear. There is a second porch at the southwest side of the house, and a shouldered exterior end chimney of brick. The house's yard has short brick piers at the front corners, and flanks the sidewalk leading to the entrance porch. Due to the house's 1963 date of construction, it is a non-contributing building in the Ridge Street Historic District.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Mary Smith Jones purchased this lot, formerly the side yard of the H. M. Gleason House at 522 Ridge Street, in 1959 (City DB 211-311). Tax records show that she built the house in 1963. She died in 1981, but the house remains in her family (WB 25-36, DB 426-140).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a vernacular Modern house with the low, rectangular form of the Ranch style, but it is unusual for the projecting bay in the center of the front facade, and the small porch next to the projecting bay. The house's fenestration, including the three-part window in the projecting bay, is typical for modern domestic architecture of the period. Although the house's brick construction is in keeping with its immediate architectural context, in its scale, form, and style, the house is not compatible with the earlier houses in the District.




