ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This 2-story, 3-bay, stucco Bungalow-style house has elements of the Craftsman style. Its broad gable roof is clad with standing-seam metal, and is broken in the front by a wide shed-roofed dormer. In the rear the back wall rises above the roof edge to encompass what was probably originally a shed-roofed dormer matching the front dormer. At the center of the rear wall is a full-height projecting bay. The north wall has a shallow, shed-roofed projecting bay, cantilevered at the first-floor level. There are elbow brackets under the eaves, and the windows are six-over-one and eight-over-one double-hung wood sash. The front dormer has two pairs of six-over-one sash. At the front of the house is a one-story, shed-roofed porch, which has been partly enclosed. While the porch appears to have been three bays wide, one bay remains open with a large square stuccoed pier at the southwest corner. The porch has a shed roof that joins to the house's roof. The enclosed portion of the porch has been fitted with six-light sash, and it extends around the house's northwest corner. There is one stuccoed interior end chimney at the north wall, and a rear interior chimney of brick. A one-story, pyramidal hip-roofed stucco garage stands at the south side of the house, which has had boarding nailed across its front bays. The lot is sloped, giving the house a raised rear foundation, and it stands at the southeast corner of the intersection of Fifth Street, Ridge Street, Cherry Avenue, and Elliot Avenue.

H. M. Gleason deeded two lots to Hope W. Gleason in 1922 (DB 48-233). According to tax records, he built this house immediately and another house north of it, also stuccoed, after selling this house in 1924 (DB 48-235). This house has had a number of owners, the longest being Rosa N. Rodgers, who owned the house from 1954 until 1980 (DB 178-336, 198-269, 409-656) and operated a beauty shop there. She enclosed the front porch in 1967. George N. and Nobuko M. Asai bought the house in 1985 (DB 467-752, 569-1). They use it as rental property, renting out each of the eight rooms separately. The house north of this one was demolished when Elliot Avenue was extended to meet Cherry Avenue in the 1950s. Additional Records: City DB 92-139 and 309, 117-105.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Gleason-Rodgers House is significant as an example of a bungalow with Craftsman-style elements, and as such it is unusual for the Ridge Street Historic District. Modifications to the house, including the enclosing of the front porch and changes to the back of the house, have compromised its integrity somewhat, but the house retains enough of its original features to be a contributing resource in the District. It is sited in an important position, on a slightly elevated corner lot at the intersection of Ridge Street, Fifth Street, Cherry Avenue, and Elliot Avenue.




