GOODWIN HOUSE

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This 2-story, 3-bay, brick house, laid in seven-course common bond, is a vernacular rendition of the transitional phase between the Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles. It has an irregular form reflecting the Queen Anne style, with a complex hipped roof clad with standing-seam metal, and simple decorative elements. There are two interior chimneys of brick. The house's central block has projecting gabled bays on the northeast end of the front facade and the northwest or rear of the southwest side. The northeast and rear walls have center gables. The gables in the projecting bays and the center gables are clad with diamond-patterned shingles, and have small rectangular louvered ventilation openings in them. The house has a boxed cornice with returns and a frieze board. The windows are two-over-two double-hung wood sash, and have shallow segmental arches. The two entrances, one in the front facade and the other in the projecting bay of the southwest side, have single-light transoms. There is a one-story, six-bay, Colonial Revival-style wraparound porch on the front and part of the southwest side, with Doric columns supporting a hipped roof. The porch's original floor has been replaced by one of concrete. The house's foundation is raised at the rear, and there is a shallow, one-story, hiproofed frame section with a small porch in its southwest half at the rear of the house. Sited on a sloping corner lot between Ridge Street and Fifth Street to the southeast and northwest, and between Barksdale Street to the southwest and the connector between Ridge and Fifth Streets to the northeast, the house has a visually important position. The property has a shallow front yard, and a deep side yard to the northeast.


HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

R. E. and Mary L. Goodwin purchased this lot in 1910 (City DB 21-310) and built the house c. 1911-12, according to tax records. After they sold it in 1931 (DB 72-388), there were several owners before Otis L. Lee bought it in 1968 to use as rental property (DB 300-95).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Goodwin House is significant as an example of a vernacular house reflecting the transition between the Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles. It retains its stylistic, character-defining features such as its irregular form, shingled gables, and boxed cornice with returns. The house sits in a prominent, highly-visible location on a corner site. It is representative of a substantial vernacular house of the early twentieth century in the Ridge Street corridor, and there are several brick houses of similar form and detailing in the District.


