ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

The toccoing of the walls and the loss of much of the porch trim has significantly altered the appearance of this house. It is two storeys tall, two bays wide, and double pile, with a two-storey rear wing. It is set on a low foundation, but due to the steep slope, the basement is above ground at the rear. Both the brick foundation and the weatherboarded walls have been covered with stucco. The very low pitched hip roof is covered with standing-seam metal, painted red, and has a boxed cornice with widely spaced brackets and a plain frieze and architrave. A nearly flat extension of the roof covers the semi-octagonal projecting side bay on the facade. There is an interior capped chimney and an exterior end chimney at the rear of the wing. Windows are double-sash, 2-over-2 light, with architrave trim. Those on the facade have shaped wooden lintels. Windows are the same height at both levels, and those in the basement and the rear wing match. A one-storey entrance porch covers the south bay of the facade and extends a short distance around the southeast corner. It has a hip roof covered with standing-seam metal with boxed cornice. The Eastlake frieze, bracketed posts, and balustrade all match those at 715 Ridge Street, as do the window lintels. Only in the south bay of the facade has been replaced with two doors, each with one light over two panels, and the stair in the side hall has been enclosed. The original one-storey, two-bay rear wing matches the main block in most details, but lacks the cornice brackets. The smaller and more recent second storey has 6-over-6 light windows and a medium-pitched gable roof covered with standing-seam metal.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

In 1892 John L. Jarman, acting as trustee for his wife Mary C. Jarman, purchased a lot on Ridge Street extending back to Fifth Street (City DB 3-320). He immediately divided the Ridge Street end in half, built this house on the northern half, and deeded the southern half to his son Matthew F. Jarman (DB 3-359). Mary Jarman died in 1900, and have been half to his son the back to story hairs (DB 36 460) and mare the southern half to his son Matthew F. McCreary bought it from Kyger's widow in 1962 (DB 235-168). He immediately stuccoed it, enclosed the back porch, and divided it into three apartments. He added the second storey over the rear wing in 1968. The house has been used as rental property for nearly half a century, and in recent years it has been allowed to deteriorate badly. The property form McCreary's estate in November, 1980 and plan to renovate it (DB 415-677).

A nearly flat extension of the roof covers the semi-octagonal projecting north bay of the facade. There is an interior capped chimney and an exterior end chimney at the rear of the wing. Windows are doublesash, two-over-two light, with architrave trim. Those on the facade have shaped wooden lintels. Windows are the same height at both levels, and those in the basement and the rear wing match. A one-storey entrance porch covers the south bay of the facade and extends a short distance around the southeast corner. It has a hip roof covered with standing-seam metal with boxed cornice. The simple Eastlake frieze, bracketed posts, and balustrade all match those at 715 Ridge Street, as do the window lintels. Only one section of the original balustrade remains, and the floor has been replaced with concrete. The original entrance in the south bay of the facade has been replaced with two doors, each with one light over two panels, and the stair in the side hall has been enclosed. The original one-storey, two-bay rear wing matches the main block in most details, but lacks the cornice brackets. The smaller and more recent second storey has six-over-six light windows and a mediumpitched gable roof covered with standing-seam metal.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The John L. Jarman House is typical of the Victorian-period houses built on Ridge Street in the late 1800's. The loss of many of those increases the importance of the remaining ones. The low-pitched roof, bracketed cornice, and tall windows give this house a suggestion of the Italianate style. It is important to the streetscape and contributes to the architectural and historical significance of the Ridge Street Historic District.




