

QUARLES APARTMENTS

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This Vernacular Colonial Revival duplex has a large I-house form, with a hipped roof covered with standing-seam metal, and two hip-roofed dormers. The house is of frame construction, is clad with wide clapboards, and has corner boards and a boxed cornice. The four-bay front facade has two entrances in the middle bays, topped with fanlights. The windows are double-hung wood sash, with four vertically-divided lights over one, while the dormers have paired one-light windows. There is a one-story, one-bay, hip-roofed porch on the southwest side, facing Lafayette Street, that has Doric columns and a balustrade with square wood balusters. The entrance leading from this porch has sidelights and a five-light transom. On the northeast side of the house is a one-story, hip-roofed vestibule, with an entrance that has a one-light transom. The house has a raised rear foundation, which has been plastered, and there is a one-story enclosed porch at the rear of the house, on concrete pier supports. The duplex stands on a sloped lot, on the east corner of the intersection of Ridge Street and Lafayette Street.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

This lot is part of a one-and-one-half-acre tract purchased by Henry Spears, an African-American man, in 1877 (ACDB 86-369). His two-story wooden house stood on this portion of the property when it was purchased by F. H. Quarles in 1914 (City DB 26-82). It appears on the 1920 Sanborn map, but was probably replaced with the present duplex c. 1921-26, according to tax records. It remains in the Quarles family (City WB 7-82, DB 170-461) and has always been used as rental property.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This building is an unusual early duplex residence in a vernacular interpretation of the Colonial Revival style, that has retained its significant stylistic elements, and is compatible with contributing residences in the District.




