ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This simple house is two storeys tall and four bays wide. The northern two-thirds is double pile and the southern third single pile. The north bay projects slightly on the facade. The house is set on a high brick foundation on a very steep lot, with the front yard filled in to the level of the water table. The walls are faced with stucco, painted pale yellow with white trim. The low-pitched truncated hip roof is covered with standing-seam metal, painted black. It has close eaves and a plain frieze. A rudimentary cornice covered by the gutter has been removed. Because of the irregular massing, one of the symmetrically placed capped chimneys is an interior chimney, while the other is located interior to the rear wall. Windows are double-sash, 6-over-6 light, with moulded trim and black louvered shutters. They are of similar height at all three levels. Basement windows are segmental-arched. A small square casement window with decorative glazing is centered on the north end of the house at the first storey level. A one-storey veranda covers the facade. It has a flat metal roof with simple balustrade, no cornice, a plain frieze, five tuscan columns, a simple balustrade, and wooden floor. The wide 6-paneled entrance door in the second bay has 3-light sidelights over panels and a 6-light rectangular transom. Above it, a 15-light door gives access to the veranda's flat roof. The southeast rear corner of the house is filled in with a flatroof one-storey wing and an open deck with simple balustrade. Access to the deck is by two 15-light doors. A onestorey back porch covers the north end of the rear elevation. It has a hip roof covered with composition shingles, projecting eaves, shaped rafter ends, square posts, and solid balustrade.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

This house has the appearance of a farmhouse, but tradition and tax records agree that the suburbs of Charlottesville had reached this area by the time it was built, or at least by the time it achieved its present form. R. L. Creasy purchased a 3.61 acre lot from the Stonefield tract in 1915 (ACDB 161-325), and tax records show that he built a house there c. 1916. Euphame C. Mallison (Mrs. George Mallison) bought the property in 1926 (City DB 53-235) and tax records note construction in that year that tripled the value of the improvements. 1926 is also the traditional date for the construction of this house, but its irregular massing would seem to suggest that a smaller building might have been enlarged in that year. Mrs. Mallison lived in the house until her death in 1962 (City WB 9-119). The house had six owners during the next twenty years, the longest being Malcolm P. & Carol L. Woodward who owned it from 1969 until 1980 (DB 232-37, 232-416, 255-470, 310-46, 414-362). Anthony C. & Julie V. Gee bought the house in 1983 (DB 434-635) and are restoring it.


