Miscellaneous descriptive information (plan, exterior and interior decoration, cornice/eave type, window type and trim, chimneys, additions, alterations)

This large 13-bay, 3-story apartment building was, according to tradition, converted from an earlier, partly-finished athletic clubhouse or gymnasium. Edmund S. Campbell, Professor of Architecture at UVa, designed the building in its present form.

Despite its handsome appearance from a distance, the brickwork is quite crude, and the floorplan is rather awkward.

Historical information

This building (or part of it) was originally planned as an athletic clubhouse for alumni, but was altered to faculty apartments before completion. Built in present form ca. 1920, it has served as housing for university employees ever since.
