#### II. Meadowcreek Golf Course Fund (609)

The sum of \$27,818 as of June 30, 2011 in restricted funds for the First Tee Program, shall be transferred and appropriated to the respective First Tee Program accounts in General Fund.

#### III. Capital Project Fund (425 and 429)

The Housing Fund account (CP-084) received rent proceeds in the amount of \$9,500 which shall be carried over and appropriated back into the Housing Fund. In order to close the City's financial records for FY11 and to finalize the City's annual financial report, we would like to request that Council approve the attached resolution to adjust certain accounts. This is a normal procedure that takes place each year.

Provided below is a brief description of the items contained in the various sections of the appropriation:

- General Fund Section I
- Meadowcreek Golf Course Section II
- Capital Projects Fund Section III
- Facilities Repair Fund Section IV
- Water and Gas Utility Funds Section V
- Grants Funds Section VI
- Social Services Fund Section VII
- Community Attention Fund Section VIII
- Schools Gainsharing Section IX

Included are names of the department or program, the amount of the adjustment and a brief discussion of the reason(s) for the appropriation.

#### I. General Fund

(a) Departmental Appropriations – Section 1 (a)

The following appropriations are requests for carryovers of unspent funds and new requests not previously appropriated.

Neighborhood Development Services – \$28,000
 These funds will be used to provide the mall Wi-Fi service.

#### City Attorney's Office - \$24,500

The City's Attorney's office has requested that \$20,000 in unspent funds from FY 2011 be carried over and used for recodification of the City Code. Additionally, \$4,500 will be carried over to replace an aging scanner which will increase the department's efficiency in archiving documents.

#### Finance - \$66,100

These funds will be used to enhance the SAP fixed asset system (\$60,000) and to cover the cost of the FY11 Cost Allocation Report (\$6,100).

#### • Economic Development - \$20,000

These funds will be used to further Workforce Development efforts and to more effectively pursue outreach efforts to the business community.

#### Human Resources - \$30,000

These funds will be used to fund a long-term temporary position that was created to respond to increased workloads in the Benefits section and Employee Relations and Training.

#### Contribution to JAUNT - \$17,625

Council has directed Charlottesville Area Transit (CAT) to provide additional holiday bus service. Federal grant requirements make it necessary for JAUNT to also provide the same extended service. These funds will be used to support the additional costs to be incurred by JAUNT for increased holiday bus service.

#### • 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration - \$65,000

These funds will be used to support the costs associated with the City's 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration. \$14,568 represents unspent funds from FY11 while \$50,432 represents new money added to support committee requests.

#### Contribution to Darden Towe Park - \$30,000

These funds will be used to pay the City's share of Darden Towe Park operations for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> quarters of FY11.

#### Jefferson School Operational Support Grant - \$50,000

These funds will be used to provide start-up operation support for the Jefferson School Foundation. This is a one-time request and in the future Jefferson School Foundation would fully fund their operations.

#### • Dialogue on Race - \$43,403

These funds will be used to provide additional funding for the City's Dialogue on Race. \$18,403 represents unspent funds carried over from FY11 while \$25,000 represents new money being added to fund committee requests.

#### Health Summit - \$17,448

These funds are used to promote public education and improve health practices and outcomes for City residents. Council has expressed a specific interest in using these funds to improve pregnancy outcomes, lower infant mortality rates and reduce childhood obesity.

#### Vending Commissions - \$435

These funds represent commissions that the City received from the sale of soft drinks and snacks from the vending machines in the Public Works break room. They will be used to pay for break room enhancements and other employee beneficial expenses that would not ordinarily be covered in the operating budget. These funds shall be appropriated and not deemed to expire until further action is taken by Council.

#### (b) Additional Transfers and Appropriations – Section 1 (b)

The following appropriations are requests for transfers from the General Fund to other funds.

Transfer to Transit – Holiday Service - \$12,500
 These funds will be used to fund Council's expressed desire to

move forward with providing a Sunday level of service on additional holidays.

- Transfer to Golf Fund \$400,000
   These funds will be used to help offset the negative fund balance in the City's Golf Fund.
- Transfer to Debt Service Fund \$2,000,000
   These funds will be transferred to the City's Debt Service Fund in an effort to reduce future debt service costs to the General Fund.
- Transfer to Capital Projects Fund \$73,843
   These funds will be used to pay the remaining City share of the 800Mhz radio system debt service.
- Transfer to Social Services Fund \$7,200
   These funds will be used to fund the local share of the expenses for the Second Chance Grant.
- Fuel Reserve \$600,000

These funds will be used to offset unbudgeted and increasing fuel costs. These funds will only be transferred as deemed necessary by the Budget Director and will be automatically deemed appropriated in those funds receiving the transfer.

(c) Excess 12% Policy Transfer – Section 1 (c)

#### Transfer to CIP - \$1,758,504

These funds will be transferred and appropriated in the CIP Contingency fund. The transfer is in keeping with the City's 12% Excess Fund Balance Policy.

#### II. Meadowcreek Golf Course - \$ 27,817.19

The sum of \$27,817.19 in restricted funds being held for the First Tee program will be transferred to and appropriated in the General Fund. Beginning with the FY12 budget, the First Tee Program will be accounted for in the General Fund.

#### III. Capital Projects Fund - \$83,343

The Housing Fund account originally provided funds for the EcoRemod House. The City is now receiving rent proceeds from in the amount of \$9,500. The rent proceeds shall be returned to the Housing Fund and available to be spent for other applicable expenses. Further, all revenue received as rent proceeds from the EcoRemod House shall be automatically appropriated into the Housing Fund and shall not be deemed to expire until further action by Council.

The City and the County entered into a joint agreement to fund the replacement of the regional 800 MHz Radio system. The City's share of the debt service was budgeted in the Capital Projects Fund. \$73,843 is the amount needed to fully fund the City's share of the remaining debt service.

#### IV. Facilities Repair Fund - \$230,184

Courthouse Maintenance (P-00099) - \$230,184 - These unspent restricted court fees will be used for future court repair work or records conversion. The amount will be carried over in the Facilities Repair Fund.

#### V. Wastewater and Gas Utilities Funds - \$255,444

- Gas Fund \$205,000 These funds will be used to up-grade two high pressure lines (\$100,000), to supplement on-going GIS mapping efforts to maintain Federal compliance (\$75,000) and for the purchase of laptops and tablets to be used for field applications (\$30,000).
- Gas Fund Utility Billing \$16,444 These funds will be used for a one-time computer upgrade for several computers that are out of warranty.
- Wastewater Fund \$34,000 These funds will be used to for professional GIS mapping services of the Wastewater system.

#### VI. Grants Fund - \$14,096

These funds were received from outside sources and are being appropriated to be spent by the respective grants:

• \$14,096 – these funds will be used for additional qualifying State Fire Grant expenditures.

#### VII. Social Services Fund - \$7,200

The sum of \$7,200 represents the local share of expenditures for the Second Chance Grant.

#### VIII. Community Attention - \$18,970

The sum of \$18,970 represents unspent grant funds received from non-city sources and shall be carried over and expended in the Community Attention fund to offset expenditures from FY11 programs still operating in FY12.

#### IX. Schools Gainsharing - \$413,498.86

In 1998, the School Superintendent and the City Manager entered into a gainsharing agreement. This agreement allows the schools to retain the funds from an operating surplus up to \$200,000 in the School's General Fund. Anything over \$200,000 will be shared equally (50/50) between the School board and the City. For the year ending June 30, 2011, the Schools had an operating surplus of \$413,498.86. According to the formula, the Schools will retain, \$206,749.43, \$100,000 will be contributed to City's School Facility Maintenance Fund and \$106,749.43 will be returned to the City's General Fund.

Should that occur, and implementation of the final Master Plan requires removal of the sculpture, then the City will not be under any obligation to keep it in its current location or form, and reserves the right to remove the sculpture if so desired; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City expresses its gratitude to the artist, Rick Brown for his ingenuity in creating this sculpture and his generosity in donating the work to the City;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Charlottesville, Virginia that the City hereby accepts the donation of the sculpture "Is Good Ole Goodloe Gone", subject to the above-listed stipulations.

**WHEREAS**, the Jefferson Park Circle Land Trust has offered to sell to the City of Charlottesville, for the purchase price of \$30,000.00, 1.867 acres of land that are identified as Parcels 32, 32.1 & 33 on City Tax Map 19, and more particularly shown on a Boundary Survey plat by Draper Aden Associates dated June 6, 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the subject property is located in the Fry's Spring neighborhood, adjacent to the Fry's Springs Beach Club; and

**WHEREAS**, City staff have recommended purchase of the subject property to provide improved trail connectivity, increased green space, and preservation of cultural resources; now, therefore

Whereas, Gig.U, the University Community Next Generation Innovation Project has been organized to accelerate the offering of next generation, world leading communications services to university communities; and

Whereas, a significant number of private sector entities have expressed an interest in furthering the goals of Gig.U members to advance next-generation networks as part of the Gig.U effort; and

Whereas, the University of Virginia is a charter member of Gig.U; and

Whereas, the City of Charlottesville is a highly educated community of over 43,000 people that has already demonstrated that it both needs and can utilize high levels of bandwidth for educational and entrepreneurial purposes; and

Whereas, the city of Charlottesville, by virtue of its population density, its population diversity, and existing communications assets, presents an ideal community in which to upgrade existing network assets at a relatively low cost; and

Whereas, the University of Virginia, with a student body of approximately 20,000, is among the world's leading research universities in a variety of fields; and

Whereas, the University of Virginia Medical Center is one of the nation's leading medical education, clinical and research centers; and

Whereas, the City of Charlottesville and the University of Virginia are working closely together with others in the Gig.U Project; and

Whereas, the City Council believes the Charlottesville community is well poised to utilize the additional bandwidth capacity; and

Whereas, the City Council believes deployment and use of such a network would be a tremendous benefit to its residents and would unleash innovative, entrepreneurial activities in a variety of fields; and

Whereas, the City Council desires that its citizens, businesses, and institutions have access to more advanced communications services than are currently available in the City; and

Whereas, the development and deployment of new communications technologies and ultra high-speed networks is necessary for economic growth and community development; and

#### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

That the Charlottesville City Council enthusiastically supports the work of Gig.U and directs its staff to work with University of Virginia staff towards its mission of accelerating the offering of next generation, world leading communications services to university communities; and

That the City Council directs it staff to work with other stakeholders in the community who can assist with the Gig.U effort; and

# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ABANDONMENT OF A NATURAL GAS EASEMENT GRANTED TO THE CITY BY NORTH PANTOPS TOWNHOUSES, LLC

**WHEREAS**, North Pantops Townhouses, L.L.C. is the owner of property located on Route 250 (Pavillions Subdivision in Pantops) in the County of Albemarle; and

WHEREAS, North Pantops Townhouses, L.L.C. has requested abandonment of a portion of the permanent natural gas easement granted to the City by deed dated June 18, 2010, of record in the Albemarle County Circuit Court Clerk's Office in Deed Book 3905, page 385, which crosses the above-referenced property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Director of Public Utilities has reviewed the request and determined that the City no longer has a need for the above-described easement; now, therefore,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Virginia Code Sec. 15.2-1800(B), a public hearing was held to give the public an opportunity to comment on the abandonment of this easement; and

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Charlottesville, Virginia that the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute a Deed of Abandonment of Easement, in form approved by the City Attorney, to abandon the above-described natural gas easement.

## RESOLUTION ACTION PLAN FOR REDEVELOPMENT OF PUBLIC HOUSING

WHEREAS, the City Council unanimously approved on March 7, 2011 a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to allow the NDS Housing Development Specialist and NDS Grants Coordinator to work with the CRHA Redevelopment Director on specific tasks to move the redevelopment process for public housing sites forward; and

WHEREAS, the CRHA Board of Commissioners unanimously approved on April 5, 2011 the above referenced MOU to allow the CRHA Redevelopment Director to work with the NDS Housing Development Specialist and NDS Grants Coordinator on specific tasks to move the redevelopment process for public housing sites forward; and

WHEREAS, the initial study period of the MOU ended in October 2011 and a final "CHRA MOU Report" was prepared by staff with input from the Director of NDS, the Director of Economic Development, and the Executive Director of CRHA on November 6, 2011 that details initial findings and scenarios for the relocation of residents from Crescent Halls, financing options for the development of the Levy site and renovation of Crescent Halls, lessons learned from other Housing Authorities visited during the MOU period, and general recommendations for redevelopment including the governance structure needed to move forward; and

WHEREAS, the CRHA MOU Report also recommended five specific Action Items that would start the process of physically renovating/rehabilitating Crescent Halls and constructing a new mixed use development at the Levy Site/Avon Garage;

WHEREAS, the CRHA Board of Commissioners approved the following Action Items at their November 28, 2011 meeting;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of Charlottesville and the Charlottesville Redevelopment and Housing Authority agree to the following Action Items, to be carried out by appropriate NDS and CRHA staff (to be determined by the Director and Executive Director respectively):

- Develop Request for Proposals (RFP's) for both renovation/ rehabilitation of Crescent Halls
  and construction of a new mixed use development at the Avon Garage/ Levy property.
  Pursue development of the Avon Garage/ Levy site to construct new facilities at this site for
  relocation and possible long term division of elderly / disabled person (noting the need to
  finalize proposed long term use prior to proceeding). It is anticipated that a mixed use
  project can be done through one or more development partners with a creative use of
  financing.
- 2. Determine how to utilize and structure (both from a staffing and board level) the CHRA non-profit [Charlottesville Development Corporation (CDC)] to undertake redevelopment

- activities. The City Attorney's office has opined that any successful redevelopment model will likely need to incorporate the City, the CDC and CRHA. Further, no other corporate entities are necessary to move forward with redevelopment at this time.
- 3. Ask City Council to appropriate funding to undertake architectural / engineering work identified through RFP processes (as described at item #1 above). It is suggested to move this forward that the funds come from the CIP contingency and, if necessary, be paid back from 2013 CHF funds. Note that CRHA currently has \$150,000 available for use but that this represents only about half of what is needed to move forward. (This request will be brought forth at a future Council meeting. No funds are to be appropriated as a result of this resolution.)
- 4. Develop financing plan for renovation of Crescent Halls.
- 5. Develop strategic plan to complete redevelopment of all other CRHA properties.
