## **RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville and Habitat for Humanity entered into an agreement dated October 31, 2011 whereby the City provided \$685,000 to Habitat for Humanity to construct three townhouse units on property on Nunley Street, designated as Parcels 94.4, 94.5, 94.6 and 94.7 on City Tax Map 23; and

WHEREAS, the agreement requires Habitat for Humanity to convey Unit B (Parcels 94.5 and 94.6) by deed of gift to Region Ten Community Services Board, and Unit A (Parcel 94.7) and Unit C (Parcel 94.4) to the Charlottesville Development Corporation for the express purpose of providing affordable housing; and

**WHEREAS,** the Charlottesville Development Corporation is not yet prepared to accept the conveyances of Units A and C; and

WHEREAS, Habitat for Humanity wishes to sell one townhouse unit (either Unit A or Unit C) to an eligible workforce employee and convey by deed of gift the other townhouse unit to the Thomas Jefferson Community Land Trust (TJCLT), which will sell the unit but retain ownership of the land; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Charlottesville that this Council reaffirms its support of the Nunley Street Townhouse project, and specifically the conveyance by Habitat for Humanity of Unit B to Region Ten by deed of gift, and conveyance of one townhouse unit to a workforce employee and one townhouse unit to the TJCLT for sale as affordable housing, or alternatively, Habitat may convey both townhouse Units A and C to TJCLT for sale as affordable housing; and

## **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this approval is conditioned upon:

- (1) Amendment of the agreement dated October 31, 2011, as to whom Units A and C will be conveyed; and
- (2) The proceeds from the sale of Units A and C being transferred to the City, which will be appropriated back to the Charlottesville Housing Fund.

# A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF COMMUNITY HOUSING PARTNERS AND THEIR APPLICATION FOR LOW INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDITS ASSOCIATED WITH THE REHABILITATION OF BLUE RIDGE COMMONS

WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville has adopted the 2025 Goals for Affordable Housing, and
