WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville, through the Police Department, has received a Charlottesville Police Department Foundation donation in the amount of \$500 to reimburse the Charlottesville Police Department for expenses associated with the "Too Good for Drugs Program".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Charlottesville, Virginia, that the sum of \$500, received from the Charlottesville Police Department Foundation, is hereby appropriated in the following manner:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Charlottesville that the membership of the Housing Advisory Committee, initially established by resolution adopted February 21, 2012 by City Council, shall be expanded to add the Monticello Area Community Action Agency (MACAA) as a Category Two representative.

Said representation will have no limit on terms and the position will exist as long as the organization exists to provide affordable housing.

RESOLUTION

Acceptance of Property from Habitat for Humanity And Allocation of Funds for Architectural Services (204 8th Street, N.W.)

WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville entered into a Funding Agreement with Greater Charlottesville Habitat for Humanity, Inc. ("Habitat"), dated December 5, 2011, to assist Habitat with the purchase of two (2) properties – 204 8th Street, N.W. and 210 8th Street, N.W. – to be developed as affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, the Funding Agreement requires the City and Habitat to create a strategic plan of redevelopment for these properties and other adjacent properties owned by the City and other parties; and

WHEREAS, the City and Habitat have not been able to successfully negotiate the purchase of all the properties in the block bordered by 8th Street, N.W., 7th Street, N.W., Page Street, and Albemarle Street (Tax Map Parcels 31-288, 31-289, 31-290, 31-291, 31-292, 31-293 and 31-294), and therefore staff has recommended that Council accept conveyance to the City of the property at 204 8th Street, N.W., to be developed in conjunction with the City of Promise grant; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Charlottesville, Virginia, that the City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to execute a Deed of Gift from Habitat for Humanity, in form approved by the City Attorney, for the conveyance of the property at 204 8th Street, N.W.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Charlottesville, Virginia, that \$20,000 is hereby allocated from the Charlottesville Housing Fund (CP-084) for the purpose of engaging the services of an architect to design a house at 204 8th Street, N.W. suitable for use as office space for a four year period, renewable at the discretion of City Council, but which ultimately will be converted to a single family home and sold as affordable housing, and the City Council hereby supports using funds from the Economic Development Strategic Investment Fund for construction of the house at 204 8th Street, N.W.
