AN ORDINANCE

CLOSING, VACATING, AND DISCONTINUING THAT PORTION OF OAK STREET, AN UNACCEPTED RIGHT OF WAY, BETWEEN 6TH STREET AND 6½ STREET, S.W. ADJACENT TO PARCELS 97 AND 185 ON CITY REAL ESTATE TAX MAP 29.

WHEREAS, Louis Baron, the owner of the property at 316 6½ Street, S.W., has initiated a petition seeking to close that portion of Oak Street, an unaccepted right-of-way running from 6th Street to 6½ Street, S.W., adjoining Parcels 97 and 185 on City Tax Map 29; and

WHEREAS, the Street which is the subject of this petition was created, circa 1888, by a subdivision plat recorded in the Albemarle County land records at Deed Book 90, page 52, and subsequently annexed into the City; however, the City has never formally accepted the 20-foot right-of-way by establishing any public street in this location; and

WHEREAS, there are no utility easements located in the subject Street; and

WHEREAS, owners along the Street proposed to be vacated have been duly notified; and

WHEREAS, following notice to the public pursuant to Va. Code Sec. 15.2-2006, a public hearing by the City Council was held on March 1, 2010, and comments from the City staff, and the public were made and heard; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of the factors set forth within the City's Street Closing Policy, adopted by Council on February 7, 2005, this Council finds and determines that the petitioners' request should be granted; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Charlottesville, Virginia that the subject Street is hereby closed, vacated and abandoned, the portion to be vacated being more particularly described as follows:

A twenty (20) foot platted street, designated as Oak Street, running approximately seventy-seven feet (77') from 6½ Street, S.W. to the eastern property line of Parcel 97 on 2010 City Real Estate Tax Map 29, adjoining Parcels 97 and 185 on said City Tax Map 60.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that, unless an appeal from Council's enactment of this ordinance is made to the Charlottesville Circuit Court within sixty (60) days of the date of adoption, the Clerk of the Council shall send a copy of this ordinance with plat attached to the Clerk of the Circuit Court for recordation in the current street closing book.

RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE

RAIL PRESERVATION APPLICATION OF

BUCKINGHAM BRANCH RAILROAD COMPANY

WHEREAS, the Buckingham Branch Railroad desires to file an application with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation for funding assistance for the projects; and

WHEREAS, Buckingham Branch Railroad has identified projects that are estimated to cost \$266,893.00 and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly, through enactment of the Rail Preservation Program, provides for funding for certain improvements and procurement of railways in the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Buckingham Branch Railroad is an important element of the City of Charlottesville's transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the Buckingham Branch Railroad is instrumental in the economic development of the area, and provides relief to the highway system by transporting freight, and provides an alternate means of transportation of commodities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville supports the project and the retention of the rail service; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has established procedures for all allocation and distribution of the funds provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Charlottesville does hereby request the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation to give priority consideration to the projects proposed by the Buckingham Branch Railroad.

Land and Water Conservation Fund Authorizing Resolution

A resolution authorizing application(s) for federal funding assistance from the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) to the Virginia Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR) as provided in the LWCF Act of 1965, as amended.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of LWCF, federal funding assistance is requested to aid in financing the cost of land acquisition and/or facility development; and

WHEREAS, the City of Charlottesville considers it in the best public interest to complete the land acquisition and/or development project described in the application;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to make formal application to DCR for funding assistance, and agrees to the following conditions if awarded the grant:

- Any fund assistance received be used for implementation and completion of <u>Parkland</u> <u>Acquisition</u> within the specified timeframe;
- 2. The City Director of Finance hereby certifies that project funding is currently available and is committed for this project;
- 3. We are aware that the grant, if approved by the National Park Service, will be paid on a reimbursement basis. This means we may only request payment after eligible and allowable costs have already been paid to our vendors and evidence of such has been provided to DCR in the format required.
- 4. We acknowledge that any property acquired and/or developed with financial aid from the Land & Water Conservation Fund must be placed in use and be retained as a public outdoor recreation area in accordance with the provisions and requirements of the Land & Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965, as amended;
- We acknowledge that we are responsible for compliance with the national Environmental Policy Act, Endangered Species Act, Historic Preservation Act and all applicable state and federal laws.
- We acknowledge that appropriate opportunity for public comment has been provided on this application and evidence of such is a required for component approval.
- 7. This resolution becomes part of a formal application to the Virginia Department of Conservation & Recreation.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF A UTILITY EASEMENT UNDER UNIVERSITY AVENUE TO THE RECTOR AND VISITORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

WHEREAS, the Rector and Visitors of the University of Virginia desire an easement for repair and maintenance of underground utility facilities which are located partially within the University Avenue right-of-way in the City; and
