Site Description:

January 2020: This two-story house is located on the east side of 10th Street NW on the south corner of 10th Street NW and Morton Lane. There is a wood fence surrounding the rear of this property, and a Charlottesville Area Transit (CAT) bus stop to the southwest. The property consists of a house and two sheds in the south corner of the property.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: The house was built in 1925, according to the City of Charlottesville Property Records. It is adjacent to Morton Lane, and the Morton (Julia, Edgar, and Stella) family owned the property for several decades (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020; Hill Directory Co. 1940; Hill Directory Co. 1959). Morton was a prominent name in the African American community, including in one of the first practical nursing classes at UVA for African Americans and for involvement in the NAACP (Cross-White 1998:36, 109). It is not known if any of the property owners are related to this family. The house appears in the 1929 Sanborn Map without the open porches on the southeast and northwest elevations, or the rear (northeast) deck (Sanborn Map Company 1929). The porches were built at some point between 1950 and 1994 (Sanborn Map Company 1950; USGS 1994). Though the rear one-story wing is clad in a different siding from the rest of the house, it could be original, since it is present in the 1929 Sanborn Map and remains the same in the 1950 Sanborn Map (Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950). One shed was built c. 2000 and the other was built c. 2019 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020).

This property retains excellent integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been mildly compromised with replaced windows and siding changes. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and two non-contributing secondary resources..

Architectural Description:

January 2020: This two-story house rests on a stuccoed foundation, is clad in stucco, and is separated into two sections. The two-story section is rectangular and houses the main entrance, and has a cross-gabled roof, while the one-story section wraps around the northeast and southeast elevations and is covered in a hipped roof. Both roofs are clad in asphalt shingles. There is an exterior stuccoed chimney to the southeast of the building near the ridgeline. The front (northwest) facade features a partial-width, one-story, open porch with a hipped roof that is supported by square wood columns that rest on stuccoed piers with low, concrete-and-stucco walls. The porch is accessed by concrete steps with metal railings. This facade also features a bay window on the first floor on the south end of the facade. The southeast elevation features a one-story side gable roof wing clad in stucco. This wing has a front-gabled wood carport extending to the south off of the southeast elevation. Visible fenestration includes a single-leaf wood door with a nine-light glass and metal storm door; and six-over-six, double-hung, vinyl windows with metal screens.
