2016: This property was surveyed in 2012-2016 by City of Charlottesville Neighborhood Development Services. The front of the lot has a two stepped concrete walkways leading from the sidewalk to each entrance. The back yard is fenced with wire and post fencing. A gravel alley runs behind the house.

2016: Ownership History

George D. Smith and W.L. Smith sold the property to L.S. Marshall on May 25, 1911 (County 146 – 323). James Hawkins bought the land in 1921(City 38 – 479). The Hawkins family continued to own the property through the 1970s.

Social History

The African American family of James Hawkins, a coal passer for the rail yard, and his wife Martha Hawkins, a laundress were the first family to own and live in the house. James died in 1922, and may have only lived in the house a short time. Martha lived there from 1921 until her death in 1945. The Hawkins heirs rented the home to another African American family from 1945 until 1955, the Lockleys. Thomas Lockley was a porter at the Redland Club and Annie F. Lockley was his wife. From 1956 until 1964, Raleigh E. Mason, a janitor at UVA, rented the house.

Statement of Significance

This 20th century single-family dwelling was owned by the Hawkins family for over fifty years. Converted into a duplex in the 1980s, the house has been heavily altered from its original form.

2020: This property is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource.

Architectural Description:

2016: This four-bay, two-story, frame and stucco duplex was built around 1921 as a single family home. The house had several rehabilitations in 1956, 1968, and 1975. It was converted into a duplex in 1988. The current dwelling has a shed asphalt shingle roof and a central interior brick chimney. There is a wide cornice at the roof line with decorative brackets and molding. On either side of the façade is a pedimented portico over an entrance with a concrete foundation, rectangular wood supports and aluminum siding in the gable. There is a four-bay, one-story shed addition in the back of the duplex. The front-facing windows are 1/1 vinyl sash with vinyl louvered shutters.
