George Smith sold the property to Elvie Banks on Nov, 17, 1915(County 161 – 134). Elvie Baker (formerly Banks) granted the land to Charles Baker (her husband) in 1921(City 37 – 212). David J. Wood, for Charlottesville Perpetual Building and Loan Company took ownership in 1931(City 72 – 291). George E. Coles bought the property in 1932(City 76 – 98). The Coles owned the property until 1970 when Arthoudious H. Haden Jr. purchased it from their estate (City 314 – 279).

Social History

George E. Coles, a janitor at UVA, and Nora Coles, his wife, lived in the house with their family from 1945 until 1964. Nora lived there alone after George's death in 1964. She passed away in 1967.

Statement of Significance

This mid-20th century single-family dwelling belonged to the George Coles family for almost twenty-five years. While, some of the original fabric of the house has been replaced with modern materials, the site holds social and community significance.

2020: This property is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP.
