Site Description:

January 2020: This two-story duplex is located on the east side of 10th Street NW at the eastern corner of Anderson Street and 10th Street NW. The site slopes downhill to the southeast, where a concrete block retaining wall runs along the Anderson Street side of the property line. There are large bushes and trees along this wall and throughout the property. There is a large parking lot at the rear of the property, shared with the adjacent building to the northeast. This property consists of a house.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to the City of Charlottesville Property Records, this building was built in 1925 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). However, it does not appear on the 1929 Sanborn Map, and does not appear until the 1950 Sanborn Map (Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950). Therefore, it is likely the building was not actually constructed until closer to 1930. The secondary entrance on the second floor of the northeast elevation, near the rear, was once an open porch, according to the 1950 Sanborn Map, but was enclosed before 2012 (Sanborn Map Company 1950; Google.com 2012). The footprint of the building has not changed since it first appeared on the Sanborn Maps in 1950 (Sanborn Map Company 1950; USGS 1994; USGS 2017).

This property retains excellent integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been mildly compromised through exterior material changes and the enclosure of the rear porch. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource.

Architectural Description:

January 2020: This two-story duplex sits on a concrete foundation, is clad in aluminum siding, and has a cross gable roof covered in standing seam metal. The front (northwest) facing facade features a full-width, one-story, open porch with a hipped roof covered in asphalt shingles. This porch sits on a concrete block foundation, is supported by turned wood columns, has turned wood railings, and is accessed via concrete stairs with wood railings. There are two entrances on this facade, near the north end. The southwest elevation features an interior brick chimney on the ridgeline. The southeast (rear) elevation has a shorter two-story, front-gabled wing with a shed roof extension on the northeast end. This elevation also features a second-story, secondary entrance accessed via wooden stairs. There is another interior brick chimney where this wing intersects the main part of the house. Visible fenestration includes single-leaf wood doors with lighted transoms and glass and metal storm doors; and six-over-six, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with metal storm windows.
