L.D. Cox and A.P. Dennis (executors for A.D. Cox) sold the property to Mrs. A.J. McPherson on June 1, 1914(County 156 – 191). In 1949, Richard B. Spears purchased the property (City 144 – 110). Moses Bryant bought it in 1960 (City 219-288) and the property remains in the Bryant family today.

Social History

Several African American families lived, owned, and rented this house through the years. William Marshall, a janitor and his wife Patsie Marshall (1922 – 1938); Caleb Marshall, a laborer, and his wife Annie Marshall (1940 – 1945); and Richard B. Spears Jr., a cook at Farmington Country Club and his wife Mary H. Spears (1950 – 1964) (In 1956, Mrs. Wilma S. Crawford (babysitter) also lived there).

Statement of Significance

This 20th century single-family dwelling is somewhat well preserved with the wood windows still intact. Originally built as a rental property by Mrs. McPherson, the house has been the home of many families.

2020: This property is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource.
