Site Description:

January 2020: This two-story duplex is located on the north corner of Grady Avenue and 11th Street NW. There are several bushes in the front yard and a large tree at the south corner of the lot. There is another bush along the northeast elevation and one near the west corner of the duplex. This property consists of a duplex.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to the Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1920 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). It is depicted on the 1920 Sanborn Maps largely as it is today, with the exception of the north corner. Originally, the north corner was a one-story wing. By 1929, the north corner was compromised of two one-story wings. Between 1950 and 1968, the north corner achieved its current two-story height (Sanborn Map Company 1920; Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1968). According to city directories, the property previously had an address of 501 and it became a duplex by 1959 (Hill Directory Co. 1931; Hill Directory Co. 1959). This may have been related to the rear wing alterations.

This property retains good integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship has been slightly compromised by replacement windows and changes to the rear wing. The roof used to be clad in standing seam metal (USGS 2016). The integrity of feeling and association is slightly impacted by its conversion into a duplex. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource.

Architectural Description:

January 2020: This two-story duplex rests on a stuccoed foundation, is clad in stucco, and has a cross-gabled roof covered with asphalt shingles. The southeast-facing façade features a one-story, almost full-width, open porch with a hipped roof that is supported by turned wood columns. The porch rests on a concrete foundation, is accessed via concrete stairs, and has two entrances at the northeast end. There is an interior brick chimney and an interior concrete block chimney located in the center of the roof on either side of the ridgeline. The north corner of the house is comprised of a two-story wing that is clad in stucco and has a shed roof. Visible fenestration includes two-over-two, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with broken faux dividers; and single-leaf wood doors with metal screen doors.
