Site Description:

January 2020: This two-story house is located on the east side of 11th Street NW, halfway between Grady Avenue and Rosser Avenue East. The house is set back from the street. There is a large tree in the front yard. There is an asphalt driveway along the southwest property line. The northeast and southwest property lines feature a chain link fence. There is a shed near the south corner of the lot and there are several large trees in the backyard and surrounding lots. This property consists of a house and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to the Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1920 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). The house is depicted on the 1920 Sanborn Maps as a two-story rectangular dwelling with a full-width, one-story, open porch and two rear outbuildings. By 1929, the rear elevation was extended to include a one-story open porch and a two-story enclosed wing. The rear outbuildings were replaced by a single garage with a porch (Sanborn Map Company 1920; Sanborn Map Company 1929). Between 1950 and 1968, the rear open porch was enclosed and incorporated into an L-shaped addition on the south corner of the house. Also, the garage was demolished (Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1968). The current shed was built by 1994 (NETR 1968; NETR 1994). According to city directories, this property was also listed as 516 11th Street NW. The Murray family resided here between 1940 and 1959, first J. Hawsey and then Victoria (Hill Directory Co. 1940; Hill Directory Co. 1950; Hill Directory Co. 1959).

This property retains good integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been slightly compromised by replacement windows. The property retains good integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

January 2020: This two-story house rests on a stuccoed concrete foundation, is clad in stucco, and has a cross gable roof that is covered with asphalt shingles. The northwest-facing facade features a full-width, one-story, open porch with a hipped roof that is supported by turned wood columns and has wood railings. The porch is accessed by a concrete step. There is a one-story, L-shaped addition with a shed roof on the south corner of the house. Visible fenestration includes six-over-six, double-hung, metal windows with metal storm windows; and a single-leaf wood door with nine lights and a metal storm door.
