Site Description:

January 2020: This one-story house is located at the southeast end of 12th Street NW, after it transitioned from asphalt to gravel. This house is set into a downward slope to the east. There is a concrete block retaining wall along the northwest and southwest property lines. The house is accessed from the street by descending concrete steps with wood railings. There are two bushes in the front yard and a small tree in the north corner of the lot. There are two large trees near the west corner. To the southeast of the house, there is a shed. The rear of the property is heavily vegetated. This property consists of a house and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to the Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1925 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). However, this build date is unlikely since the rest of the properties on 12th Street NW north of Rosser Avenue East were not developed until the 1950s. The property was purchased by Rachel Poindexter in 1956. The 1959 city directory does not list this address, so it was likely built in the early 1960s. The house is discernible in a 1963 aerial photograph. The shed was built c. 1994 (Hill Directory Co. 1959; NETR 1963; NETR 1968). Many if not all of the buildings on this block were built by Reverend Charles H. Brown. However, this house exhibits a different form and method of construction, so it is not known if Brown also built this property (Brennan 2012:13-14).

This property retains good integrity of location. The integrity of setting has been slightly compromised by the multi-family residential development to the north, built by 1968 on previously undeveloped land (NETR 1968). The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship has been slightly compromised by replacement windows and siding.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

January 2020: This one-story house rests on a concrete foundation, is clad in aluminum siding, and has a low-pitched front gable roof that is covered in asphalt shingles. There is an interior concrete block chimney in the center of the ridgeline. The northwest-facing façade includes a front-gable asphalt shingled awning over the main entrance at the southwest end. There is a slightly shorter, one-story, shed roof wing on the southeast elevation. A wood deck with wood railings runs along the northeast elevation and wraps around to the southeast elevation, with stairs at the southwest end. Visible fenestration includes a single-leaf wood door with six lights and a metal and glass storm door; one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with metal storm windows; and sliding vinyl windows.
