Site Description:

January 2020: This house is located at the south corner of Grady Avenue and 13th Street NW. It has mature trees in the front and rear yards. The sidewalk along the northwest and northeast elevations are lined with mature bushes. The rear of the property is enclosed with a tall wood fence. There is a shed along the southwest property line. There is a structure with a plastic tarp covering to the southeast of the shed. It has not been inventoried as it appears to be temporary. This property consists of a house and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to the Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1914 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). The house first appears on the 1920 Sanborn Map. The two-story, L-shaped house was built with a one-story porch on the façade; a small open-air porch sited within the "L" on the southwest elevation; and a one-story wing on the rear elevation (Sanborn Map Company 1920). By 1929, the porch on the southwest elevation had been removed and a one-story addition wrapped around the east corner of the house (Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950). It is unknown when the one-story addition on the rear of the house was replaced with the current two-story rear addition, according to maps and aerials this occurred between 1950 and 2002 (Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 2002). According to Google Streetview, the shed in the rear yard and wood deck on the rear of the house were added between 2008 and 2017. This property was historically addressed 418 13th Street NW. The Henry family resided here as early as 1931, including Nelson, Frank, and Rozella/Roselia A Henry, who owned the property until 2000 (Hill Directory Co. 1931; Hill Directory Co. 1950; Hill Directory Co. 1959; City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020).

This property retains good integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been compromised by replacement cladding and windows, loss of the historic porch on the southwest elevation, multiple additions constructed on the rear elevation, and addition of a modern outbuilding to the property. This property retains good integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains fair integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

Architectural Description:

January 2020: This two-story house rests on a concrete foundation, is clad in vinyl siding, and has a hipped roof that is covered with asphalt shingles. There is a one-story, almost full-width, open porch on the northwest-facing facade. The porch has a concrete floor, is supported by tapered wood columns on brick piers, and has a hipped roof with asphalt shingles. The main entranceway is located at the southwest end of the façade. A two-story addition is located on the rear (southeast) elevation. It has a secondary entranceway on the southwest elevation, with a hipped roof portico. There is a one-story wood deck with wood trellis above, located on the southeast elevation. Many of the windows on the house have inoperable wood shutters. Visible fenestration consists of six-over-six, double-hung, vinyl windows; a single-leaf wood door with a single light and side lights; and double-leaf vinyl doors with one-light.
