Site Description:

January 2020: This one-story warehouse is located on the west side of Albemarle Street between Preston Avenue and West Street. There is a paved driveway along the northeast property line that leads to a parking area surrounded by a chain link fence. This area houses a number of deteriorating vehicles as well as a shed, which sits in the north corner of the property. This property consists of a large warehouse and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: This building was built in 1939, according to Charlottesville City Property Records (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). This is supported by the Sanborn Maps, since the building first appears on the 1950 map as two separate buildings: the first was a store with pipe storage in the rear, and the other was designated for plumbing (Sanborn Map Company 1950). These buildings were connected sometime between 1950 and 1963, according to aerial photographs, to create the L-shaped building that exists today (Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1963). The property was bought in 1980 by Concrete Contractors, Inc. and continued to be used commercially until it was bought in 2008 by Roger Van Liew, who then sold it to 215 Albemarle LLC in 2015, the current property owner (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). The shed in the north corner of the property was constructed in 2004 (USGS 2003; USGS 2005). The Coca-Cola Bottling Works to the northwest of the property was renovated in in 2014, including the parking lot that is adjacent to this building, changing the setting of the warehouse (USGS 2014).

This property retains good integrity of location and setting, with the setting mildly compromised by the expansion of the nearby Coca-Cola Bottling Works in 2014 (USGS 2014). The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship has been compromised by alterations to the façade. Overall, this building retains fair integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

January 2020: This one-story building is constructed of concrete block, and has a M-shaped roof covered with asphalt shingles. This building consists of two adjacent front-gabled buildings of different lengths, with a unified façade. The front (southeast) facing façade includes a stepped parapet wall and a raised concrete platform. There are three entrances on this façade, two of which are located in a recessed and angled section in the center. The northeast elevation features an exterior, concrete block chimney in the northwest half. Visible fenestration includes a single-leaf steel door; single-leaf wood doors, one with a wood screen door; two-light, sliding metal windows; boarded up windows; and one-over-one, double-hung, metal windows.
