## **Site Description:**

January 2020: This two-story duplex is located on the south side of Anderson Street, west of 8th Street NW. There is a low brick retaining wall along the northeast edge of the property, broken by concrete steps leading to each of the front doors. The rear of the property is surrounded by a metal, chain-link fence, and the northwest property line has several deciduous trees and shrubs. There is a one-story secondary dwelling to the southwest of the duplex, accessed by a gravel driveway from 8th Street NW. This property consists of a duplex and a secondary dwelling.

### Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to Charlottesville City Property Records, the duplex was constructed in 1925, while the secondary building was constructed in 1930 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). According to the Sanborn Maps, since they are not present on the 1929 Map, but do appear on the 1950 Sanborn Map, both buildings were likely constructed in 1930 (Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950). The duplex is listed as apartments on the 1950 Sanborn Map Company 1950). The 1959 city directory lists four units at this address (Hill Directory Co. 1959). The rear of the duplex was altered after 1964, enclosing a section of the porch on the east end and adding to the west end (NETR 1964; NETR 1968). The secondary dwelling does not seem to have changed over the years (USGS 1994; USGS 2017).

This property retains excellent integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship has been compromised in both buildings by replacement windows and by rear additions and enclosures on the duplex. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one contributing secondary resource.

**Architectural Description:** 

January 2020: This two-story duplex sits on a brick foundation and is clad in stucco with full-height large brick piers on the facade. The roof is hipped with two lower cross gables and central front gables and covered with asphalt shingles. There are two interior brick chimneys, one on either side of the center on the ridgeline. The front (northeast) facing façade includes two entrances, one on either end. The entrances have brick cladding on both sides and are surmounted by metal shed roof awnings. The rear (southwest) facing elevation features several wings. At the southeast end, there is a narrow two-story, hipped roof projection. To the northwest of that, there is a two-story shed roof projection with wood stairs along its southwest elevation. To the northwest of that, there is a slightly shorter, two-story shed roof projection. The northwest half of the southwest elevation also features a pedimented gable with a two-story shed roof wing in front of it. Visible fenestration includes one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with metal storm windows; six-over-six, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with screens; and single-leaf, wood doors with six or nine lights.

January 2020: There is a secondary dwelling to the southwest of the duplex. This building sits on a stuccoed foundation, is clad in stucco, and has a cross-gabled roof covered in asphalt shingles. There is an interior, concrete chimney in the center of the ridgeline. On the northeast elevation, there is a small gabled projection at the northwest end. In the center of the northeast elevation, there is an entrance (USGS 2017). The southwest elevation has a larger gabled projection in the northwest end. There is a secondary entrance on the southeast elevation of this projection, with a wood porch with wood railings, accessed by concrete steps with concrete railings. Visible fenestration includes a single-leaf, wood door with nine lights; and one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl windows.
