Site Description:

January 2020: This two-story house is located on the north side of Anderson Street, east of 10th Street NW. The southwest property line is bounded by a concrete block retaining wall with a brick corner pier at the northwest end. There are box hedges in the front of the property, a paved parking pad to the southeast of the house, and more box hedges running along the southeast property line. There is a shed in the northwest corner of the property, and a metal, chain-link fence along the rear property line. This property consists of a house and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1925 and has been owned by the Woodfolk family since about 1950 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020; Hill Directory Co. 1950). The house first appears on the 1929 Sanborn Map, replacing a previous building on the 1920 Sanborn Map, with a square garage in the rear of the building, but without the rear, full-width, one-story addition; it looks the same in the 1950 Sanborn Map (Sanborn Map Company 1920; Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map company 1950). This rear addition does appear on the 1963 aerial photographs, though the garage was demolished by that point (NETR 1963; NETR 1964). The shed that stands today was constructed in 2005 (USGS 2005; USGS 2006).

This property retains excellent integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship has been compromised by replacement cladding and windows. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

January 2020: This two-story house sits on a brick foundation, is clad in aluminum siding, and has a cross-gabled roof clad in asphalt shingles. The front (southwest) facing façade features a full-width, one-story, open porch with a hipped roof and sits on a concrete block foundation. The porch roof is supported by turned wood columns and the porch has wood railings. The main entrance for this house is at the east end of this façade. There is an interior, brick chimney located near the northeast end of the ridgeline. There is a full-width, one-story, shed roof wing on the northeast (rear) facing elevation. It has a secondary entrance on the southeast elevation, that is surmounted by a slight shed roof awning covered with corrugated metal. Visible fenestration includes one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl windows; fixed, single-light, vinyl windows; a large picture window with two, one-over-one, double-hung, vinyl side lights; one-over-one, double-hung, metal windows; a single-leaf metal screen door; and a single-leaf, wood door with nine lights and a metal and glass storm door.
