Site Description:

January 2020: This one-and-a-half-story house is located on the north side of Gordon Avenue, at the east corner of Gordon Avenue and 13th Street NW. There is a tall tree in the south corner of the property and a large bush in the north corner. There is also a gravel parking pad taking up the majority of the front yard. The southeast side of the property is surrounded by a white, picket, vinyl fence. This property consists of a house and a shed.

Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1927 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). This is supported by the Sanborn Maps, since the property first appears in the 1929 Sanborn Map with the same footprint as in the 1950 Sanborn Map. Its two dormers and the small one-story addition on the rear of the house, where built between 1950 and 1963 (Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1963). The current shed was constructed in 2008, according to aerial photographs (USGS 2007; USGS 2008; USGS 2009).

This property retains excellent integrity of location and setting. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been mildly compromised by replacement windows. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one non-contributing secondary resource.

Architectural Description:

January 2020: This one-and-a-half-story house is constructed of red, stretcher-bond brick, and has a side-gabled roof covered with asphalt shingles. There is a one-story, full-width, open porch on the southwest-facing façade, covered by the house's main roof. The porch roof is supported by brick columns and metal filigree posts, and the porch has metal railings. Below the porch is wood latticework. This façade also features a front-gabled dormer clad in wood shakes. The main entrance is located on the southeast end of the facade. There is an exterior brick chimney near the center of the northwest elevation. On the northeast elevation, there is a one-story, partial-width, shed-roof addition in the east half clad in vertical vinyl siding. This elevation also has a front-gabled dormer that is clad in wood shakes. The fenestration openings on the main elevations of the house are slightly arched. There is a one-story, exterior, wood deck to the northeast of the property. Visible fenestration consists of one-over-one, double-hung, wood windows, some of which have faux dividers; six-over-one, double-hung, vinyl windows in groups of two and three; and a single-leaf, wood door, with a metal barred storm door.
