C. W. Rogers et al (C.P.B. and L.) trustees sold the land to William Wars on April 8, 1919(City 49 – 109). Lawrence D. Rosa Lee Keyes bought the property in 1947(City 134 – 456). The Keyes owned the house through the 1970s.

Social History

Several African American families rented the house through the 1920s until the 1940s including: 1927: Mildred Campbell, a maid, and her sister Louis Campbell, also a maid (1927 -1929); Charles Bryant, a laborer and his wife Lydia Bryant (1929 – 1933); Charles Blakey and his wife Lucille Blakey (1933 – 1946). In 1947, Lawrence D. Keyes and his wife Rosalee W. Keyes owned and lived in the home. They lived there until 1960 when the house was rented to the Page family for a few years (1960 - 1964), Lloyd Page, a laborer at K.E. Lee and Son, his Margaret Page, and their daughter Harriet Page.

Statement of Significance

This 20th century single-family dwelling is similar in form to many of the other homes in the neighborhood. While, some of the original fabric of the house has been replaced with modern materials, the site holds social and community significance.

2020: This property is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and two non-contributing secondary resources.
