January 2020: This two-story house is located on the north side of Rosser Avenue East to the west of Preston Avenue. The property is surrounded by a wood picket fence, and there are tall box hedges along the south property line. There is a long driveway on the west side of the property. This property consists of a house that is sited at an angle.

#### **Surveyor Assessment:**

January 2020: According to City of Charlottesville Property Records, this house was constructed in 1925 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). However, it appears on the 1920 Sanborn Map, meaning it was constructed prior to that date (Sanborn Map Company 1920; Sanborn Map Company 1929). Sometime after 1950, a rear enclosed porch was placed on the house, but the date of this change is undiscernible on aerial photographs (Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1963; USGS 2017).

This property retains good integrity of location. The integrity of setting has been impacted by the rerouting of Preston Avenue and the construction of the duplex to the north. The integrity of design, materials, and workmanship have been impacted by replacement windows, replacement cladding, and the rear porch addition. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource.

#### **Architectural Description:**

January 2020: This two-story house rests on a concrete block foundation, is clad in asbestos siding, and has a cross-gable-on-hipped roof covered in asphalt shingles. There is an interior concrete chimney in the center of the ridgeline. The front (southeast) facing facade features a two-story bay window with a front gable roof with wood dragon's tooth shingles on the gable end. The facade also has a one-story, full-width, engaged, open porch with a hipped roof that wraps around the southwest corner of the house. The porch roof is supported by square wood columns. The porch has wood railings, and is accessed via concrete steps. There is a pedimented gable on the southwest elevation that is clad in wood dragon's tooth shingles. The northwest (rear) elevation has a screened/enclosed porch with a shed roof. It has a secondary entrance, accessed via wood steps with wood railings. The gable end on the northwest elevation is also clad in wood dragon's tooth shingles. Visible fenestration includes six-over-six, double-hung, metal windows with metal storm windows; one-over-one, double-hung, metal windows with metal storm windows; and a single-leaf, wood door with nine-lights, transom, and two side lights.
