**Site Description:** 

January 2020: This two-story house is located on the north side of West Street. There is a long line of hedges along the northwest and southeast sides of the property, and two large trees and a low concrete-block wall on the southwest side of the property. The rear of this house has been encroached upon by the brick end of commercial building redevelopment of the Coca-Cola Bottling Works on Preston Avenue, and the garage at the rear of the property is covered in vines. This property consists of a house and a garage.

#### Surveyor Assessment:

January 2020: According to Charlottesville City Property Records, this house was constructed in 1920 (City of Charlottesville GIS Viewer 2020). However, it first appears on the 1913 Sanborn Maps as 828 West Street, with the same footprint that appears in the 1950 Sanborn Map (Sanborn Map Company 1913; Sanborn Map Company 1950). Sanborn maps depict three secondary resources, including a garage; none of which are extant. The present secondary resource, which appears to be a secondary dwelling, was built between 1950 and 1963 (Sanborn Map Company 1920; Sanborn Map Company 1929; Sanborn Map Company 1950; NETR 1963; USGS 1994; USGS 2017). A rear deck was added to the house around 2007 (USGS 2006; USGS 2007).

This property retains good integrity of location and setting. The integrity of setting is mildly compromised by the encroachment from the commercial development on Preston Avenue. This property retains good integrity of design, materials, and workmanship, compromised by the added deck and replacement windows. This property retains excellent integrity of feeling and association. Overall, this property retains good integrity.

This property is recommended as not individually eligible for listing in the NRHP due to a lack of historical significance. However, it is located in the potential 10th & Page Historic District, which is recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP. Further study is recommended to determine if the 10th & Page Historic District is eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A in the areas of Ethnic Heritage, Community Planning and Development, and Social History, and under Criterion C in the area of Architecture. This property includes one contributing primary resource and one contributing secondary resource.

#### **Architectural Description:**

January 2020: This two-story house sits on a stuccoed foundation, is clad in stucco, and has a cross-gabled roof with a centered front gable covered in asphalt shingles. The front (southwest) facing facade features a full-width, one-story, open porch with a hipped roof. The porch roof is supported by turned wood columns. The porch has wood railings and is accessed by wood stairs with wood railings. The windows on this facade have fixed wood shutters. The rear (northeast) elevation includes a two-story, hipped roof wing clad in vinyl siding. This wing has a one-story, hipped roof wing on its northeast elevation. There is also a wood deck on the northeast elevation. Visible fenestration includes two-over-two, double-hung, vinyl windows, some with storm windows; and a single-leaf, wood door with a metal storm door and a transom with sidelights.
