Robley Dunlison had already purchased DAVID Hern's wife Fanny and their youngest child Bonnycastle at the January 1827 Monticello estate sale (Harriette Dunlison to Nicholas P. Trist, 13 Jan. 1827 [NcU: NPT]; Lucia Stanton, *Free Some Day: The African-American Families of Monticello* [2000], 65–6). Sydney R. PELLET and Ira Pellet signed a promissory note and subsequently settled the debt for the purchase of Moses Gillette.
