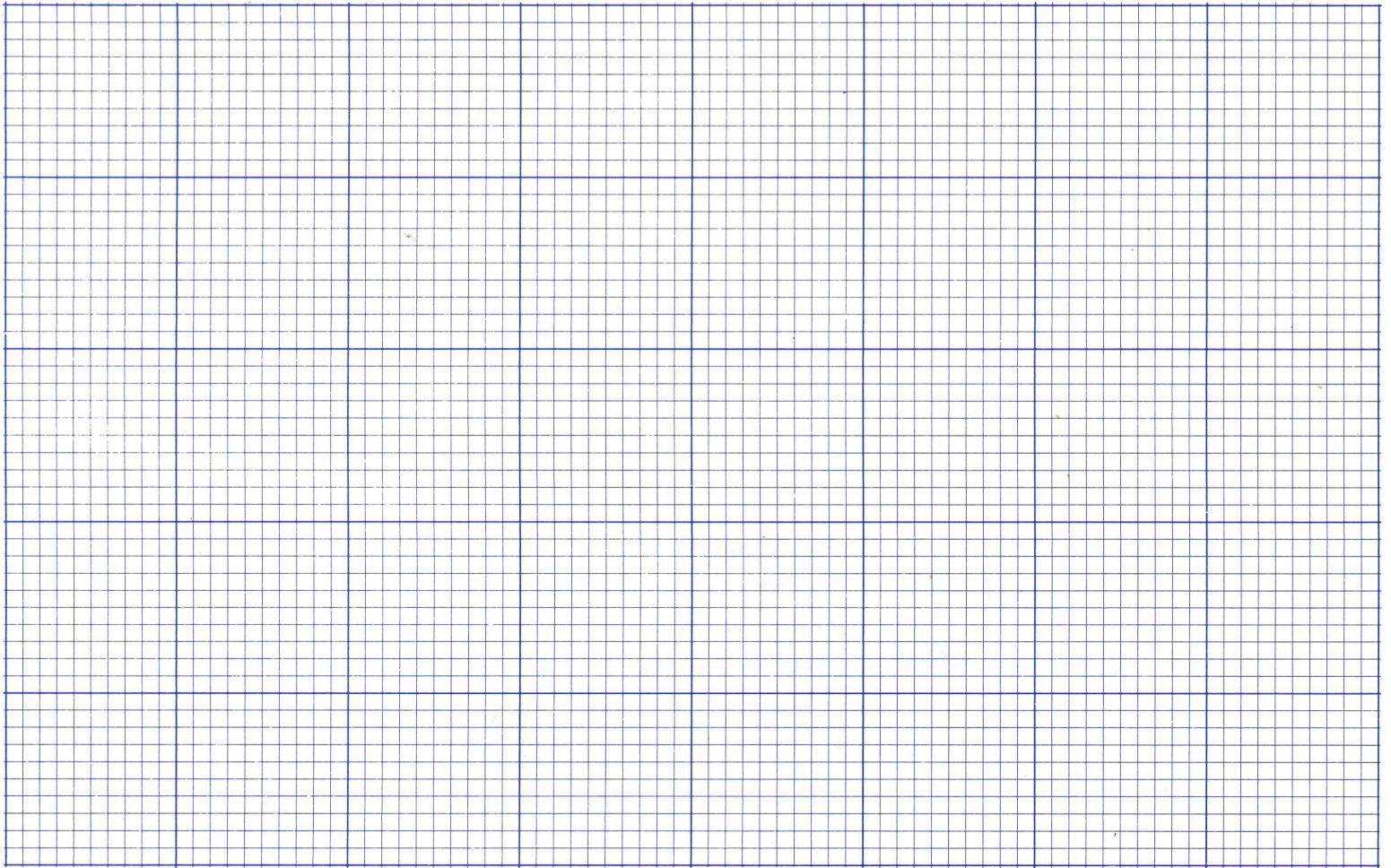

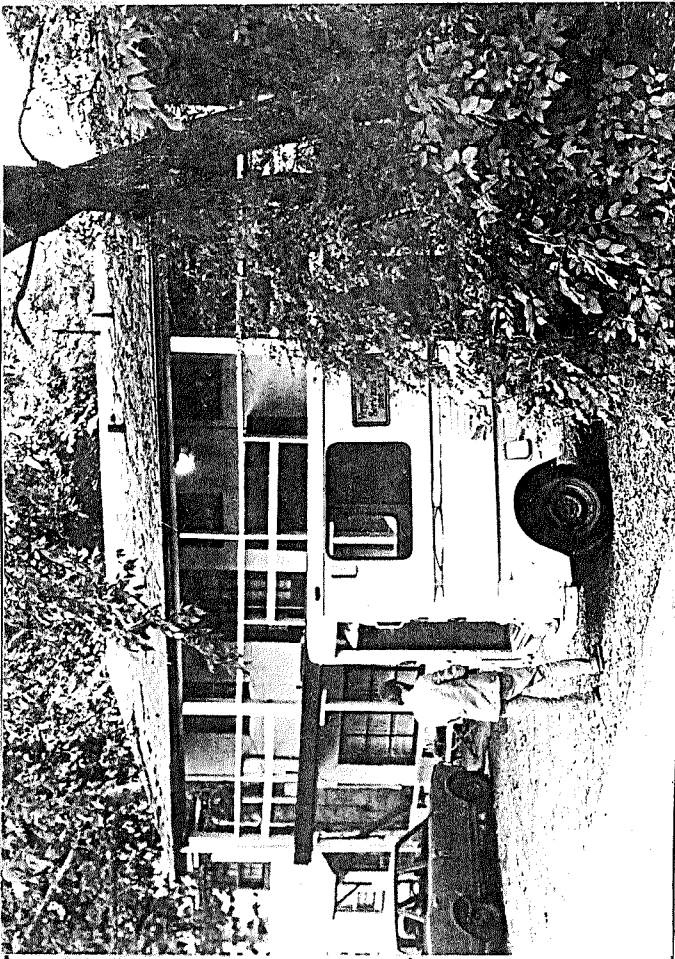

Simple, rectangular apartment building concrete block, with two-story, two-level porch across front facade, with wood posts and railing with square wood spindles; gables are frame construction. Six-bay front facade contains two entrances on each level; building is two bays deep.

Porch has been reconstructed with new railing since 1983 (O'Dell 1983).

Significance Statement:

This simple dwelling, constructed without stylistic identity of low-cost materials, does not contribute to the historic district. It apparently is older than it appears, however; dated c. 1950 for an earlier survey, it is included on the Sanborn map from 1941, identified as a dwelling. It replaced a smaller rectangular building on the same site in 1929 (O'Dell 1983; Sanborn 1920, 1929, 1941, 1969).

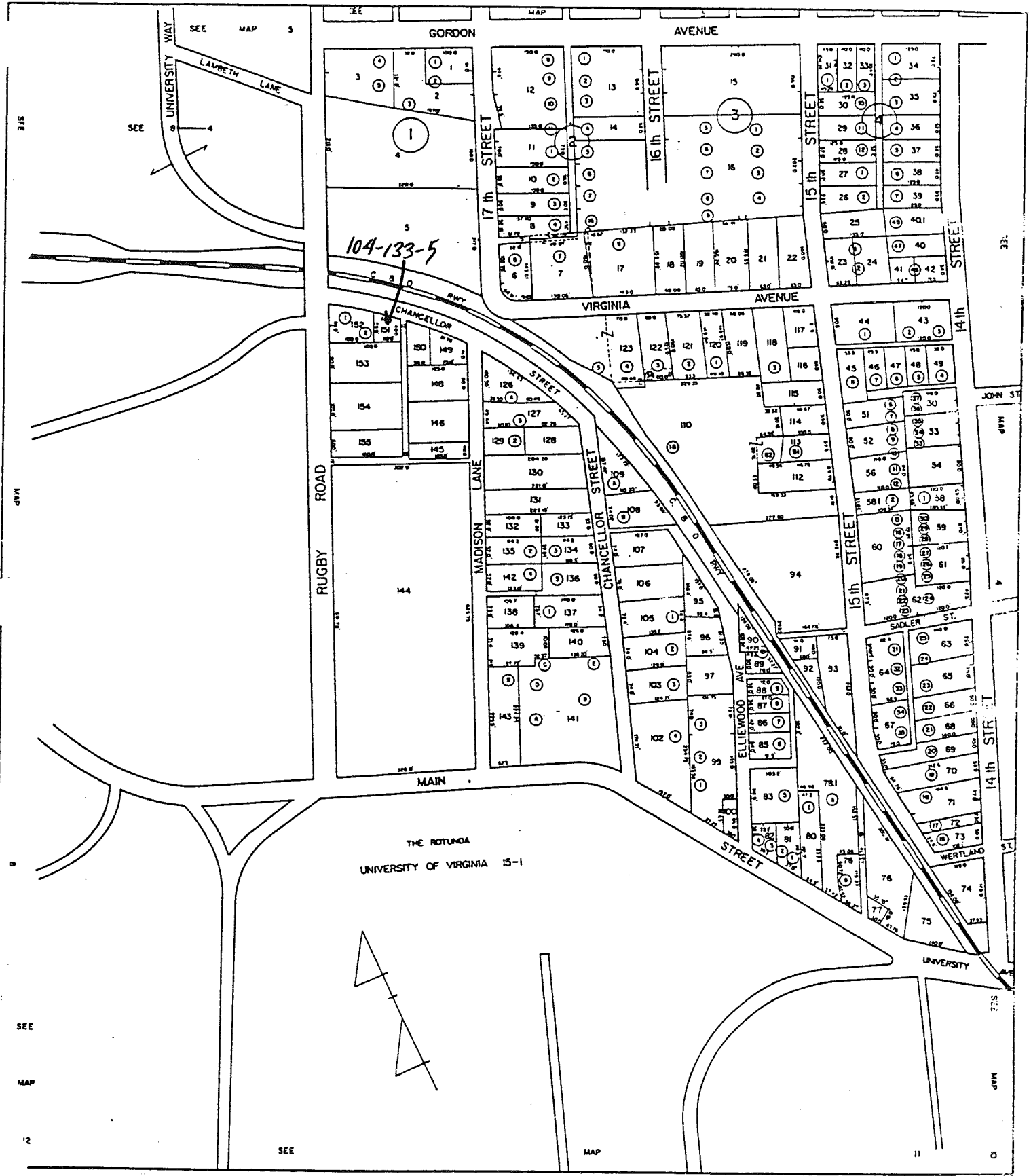

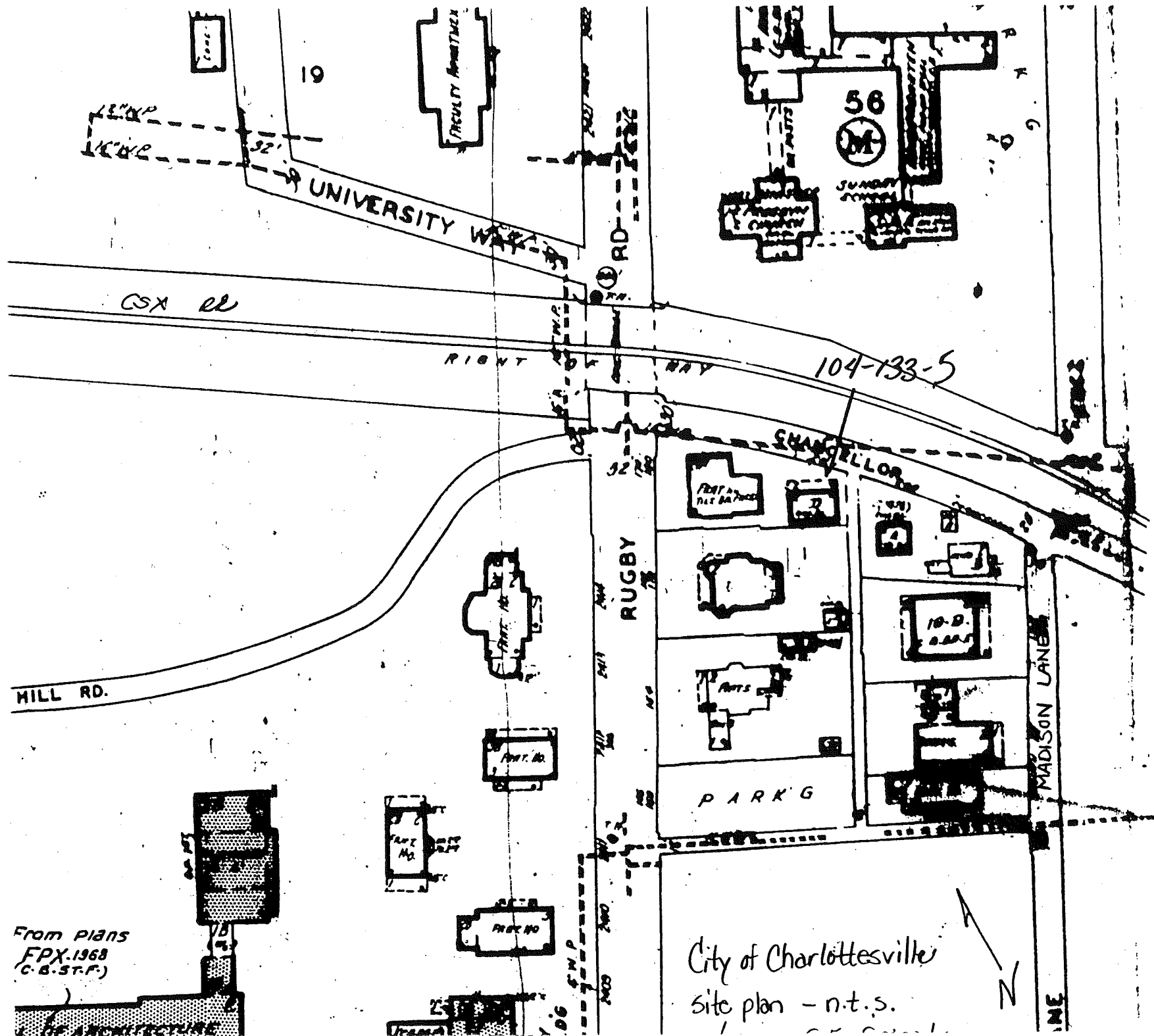
