ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This house apparently originally faced east toward Seventeenth Street. Later, after the addition of a west wing, original section is $2\frac{1}{2}$ storeys tall, two bays wide (eastern elevation) and double pile. It is set on a low brick foundation with a full basement. Walls are stuccoed and painted white with black trim. It has a high-pitched hip roof with steep gables over projecting bays on the east and north and an extension of the hip roof over a semioctagonal projecting bay on the south side. The roof is covered with slate and has exposed rafter ends. There is one interior chimney with a small cap. There are two hip-roofed, stuccoed dormers on the south elevation, each with a 4-light casement window with plain trim. There is a shed-roofed, slate-walled dormer with a pair of 4-light casement windows on the west elevation. A semi-elliptical arched third storey balcony with a broad and steep gable roof is set into the roof in the north bay of the east facade. It has a door flanked by two small windows in a Palladian window effect. Below it, the roof bends into a steeper shed roof above the entrance. The large windows are double-sash, 2-over-2 light, with architrave trim. Some are arranged in pairs, and they are nearly the same height at all three levels. Windows in the side planes of the semi-octagonal bay are narrow 1-over-1 light and in the center plane are paired 1-over-1 at the 2nd level and a single wide 3-over-3 at the first level. There is a pair of 6-light casement windows above the east entrance. At one time a one-storey veranda covered the east facade. It was replaced with a small entrance porch c. 1920. There is a nearly identical porch on the north They have steep hip roofs covered with slate with boxed cornice, plain frieze, square pillars (paired on the east porch), no balustrade, and brick-bordered concrete floors. The north porch has built-in wooden benches between the pillars. Both entrance doors are multi-light over four panels with architrave trim. The east door is somewhat wider, and the north door has a 2-light rectangular transom. In the eastern bay of the south elevation, there is a pair of French doors with a transom, sheltered by a slate shed-roofed hood. This would suggest that there was once a veranda there, but the Sanborn maps do not show one. The 2-storey west wing nearly doubles the size of the house. It has a low-pitched hip roof which dips into a steeper pitched shed roof at the western end. It is covered with standing-seam metal and has exposed rafter ends. Because of the slope of the land, the basement is above ground at the west and south. The walls are stuccoed, and the windows on the north facade are similar to those in the original section.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Thomas T. Wood purchased three lots in Preston Heights in 1891 (ACDB 95-383) and built this house the same year, according to tax records. He sold it to Mrs. Belle M. Bidgood in 1902 (ACDB 123-243). Tax records suggest that the addition was built c. 1910 by Mrs. Bidgood's children, to whom she had left the house in 1909 (ACWB 31-437). Ellen S. Shaw bought the house from the Bidgoods in 1927 (City DB 58-116) and sold it in 1931 to A. P. Walker (DB 74-111), who sold it to Annie Atkinson Walker (Mrs. Charles M. Walker) in 1941 (DB 108-247). Apparently it was the Walkers who stuccoed the house and changed its orientation from Seventeenth Street to Gordon Avenue. In 1952 Mrs. Walker sold the house to Chi Corporation of Zeta Beta Tau for use as a fraternity house (DB 164-397). In 1958 Zeta Beta Tau purchased a house on Maury Avenue and sold this house to Allen J. Berry, et al (DB 204-432), who immediately resold it to Column Club, Inc. (DB 208-322), the house corporation of Phi Sigma Kappa fraternity which has occupied the house since that time.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This house apparently originally faced east toward Seventeenth Street. Later, after the addition of a west wing, it was re-oriented toward Gordon Avenue on the north, ignoring the lack of continuity between the two sections. The original section is $2\frac{1}{2}$ storeys tall, two bays wide (eastern elevation) and double pile. It is set on a low brick foundation with a full basement. Walls are stuccoed and painted white with black trim. It has a high-pitched hip roof with steep gables over projecting bays on the east and north and an extension of the hip roof over a semioctagonal projecting bay on the south side. The roof is covered with slate and has exposed rafter ends. There is one interior chimney with a small cap. There are two hip-roofed, stuccoed dormers on the south elevation, each with a 4-light casement window with plain trim. There is a shed-roofed, slate-walled dormer with a pair of 4-light casement windows on the west elevation.
